**SUBJECT:** Recommendation, in accordance with NRS 244.1505, to approve allocation

of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds through the Coronavirus State

and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (SLFRF) in the total amount of

[\$2,255,000], approve associated resolutions, and authorize the County Manager to sign necessary award documents, for the following seven projects awarded to government entities or nonprofit organizations created for

charitable, religious, or educational purposes:

- 1. Nation's Finest Veterans Services to support the enhancement of the Health Care for Homeless Veterans (HCHV) residential program by integrating Veteran Service Officer (VSO) positions; provide essential services to homeless veterans, focusing on securing veterans' benefits and addressing substance use and behavioral health issues in the amount of \$150,000 and approve Resolution R24-92
- 2. Sun Valley General Improvement District to support projects consist of sealing and striping of the parking lot, walking paths, and basketball court at Highland Ranch Park. This will also support purchase and installation of security cameras at Gepford Park, and picnic benches, in the amount of \$60,000 and approve Resolution R24-93
- 3. Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe Gerlach Fire Services to support cost coverage of the hourly cost of firefighting employees of the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe through provision of two firefighters (EMT-A or Paramedic) 24 hours per day, 365 days per year located in Gerlach to perform initial fire and emergency medical services, in the amount of \$200,000 and approve Resolution R24-94
- 4. Public Defenders Paralegal Program to support Washoe County Public Defender and the Alternate Public Defender's offices to hire temporary paralegals, in the amount of \$80,000.
- 5. Community Spay & Neuter Project, to support the operation of a public high-volume, high-quality spay/neuter program at the Nevada

Humane Society (NHS). This funding will support a program aiming to perform 5,000 surgeries within the first 12 months of operation and grow to 7,000 surgeries the following year. This volume of low-cost surgeries will effectively reduce the number of unwanted animal births annually in our community in the amount of \$750,000 and approve Resolution R24-95

- 6. Rancho San Rafael Community Events Space Phase I, engineering, design, and site prep only for an open-air multi-purpose stage and community events space for performances, and educational programs, in the amount of \$1,000,000
- 7. Recruitment Incentive, to amend the existing award by \$15,000 for a total amount of \$165,000. The Washoe County Recruitment & Retention Incentive Program is used to assist with the recruitment and retention of employees in difficult to fill positions in the County that are impacted by a shortage of qualified labor in the region. This additional funding is to cover the additional employee incentives that were not initially included in this program.

### SUMMARY

Washoe County has worked to identify community-based initiatives and regional programs to support community members in recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. The 8 projects named in this report represent a \$2,255,000 investment in public health, children, housing security, and economic development in the community. Projects were selected in accordance with Washoe County strategic goals and objectives, Board ARPA-SLFRF Guiding Principles, and ARPA-SLFRF eligibility. The Board of County Commissioners have authority to approve new ARPA projects over \$500,000 and approve sub-granting of funds to nonprofit organizations and governmental entities in accordance with NRS 244.1505.

This report represents the allocation of the majority of the remaining ARPA-SLFRF funds received by Washoe County. County has reserved a modest contingency of the remaining SLFRF funds for potentially necessary amendments until the Treasury's obligation deadline of December 31, 2024.

Washoe County Strategic Objective supported by this item: Fiscal Sustainability, Economic Impacts, Vulnerable Populations, and Innovative Services

#### PREVIOUS ACTION

On August 20, 2024, the Board of County Commissioners approved \$3,197,900 in additional funding allocations to six new projects and six project amendments.

On June 25, 2024, the Board of County Commissioners approved a modification to an existing project titled Second Judicial District Court – Family Peace Center changing the Family Peace Center Coordinator position which was funded part-time to a full-time position. This resulted in a net-zero impact.

On May 28, 2024, the Board of County Commissioners approved the subaward with resolution for a newly funded ARPA project for the Emergency Eviction Prevention Program of Nevada (EEPPN) for \$200,000 to assist 300-320 households at risk of homelessness through housing stabilization advisory and resource navigation, preservation of rental history and preservation of relationships between landlords and tenants.

April 23, 2024, the Board of County Commissioners approved additional allocations in the amount of \$326,696 for a total amended award of \$451,696 to the following existing projects amendments: Behavioral Health Crisis Response plan; to support a coalition of community partners and facilitation of strategic planning and implementation of a sequential intercept model (SIM) in Washoe County and implementation and transition for the behavioral health crisis response system project management to Washoe County.

On March 19, 2024, the Board of County Commissioners approved additional allocations in the amount of \$303,197; to the following new projects, Human Services Agency GenArete Pilot Program (\$49,500), which will utilize a dynamic tool to create high quality, individualized learning plans for children with developmental disabilities; Permanent Supportive Housing – Supportive Services Needs Assessment (\$28,000), which will provide funds to conduct a comprehensive needs assessment for supportive services in Northern Nevada; and approved an increased allocation to the previously approved project: for the District Attorney's Office – Court Case Backlog Personnel Workstations by \$225,697 for a total of \$616,429 to cover fire and seismic requirements as well as increased construction costs.

#### **BACKGROUND**

On March 11, 2021, the American Rescue Plan Act was signed into law, and established the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund and Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund. Washoe County was awarded a grant of \$91,587,038 in State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF).
