


American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF)

\$350 billion to state, local, and tribal governments to:

- Fight the pandemic and support families and businesses struggling with its public health and economic impacts,
- Maintain vital public services, even amid declines in revenue, and
- Build a strong, resilient, and equitable recovery by making investments that support long-term growth and opportunity.

Washoe County received \$91,587,038





Washoe County ARPA-SLFRF Update

As of 6/9/2022:

- Approved Projects: 30
- Allocated Funds: \$50,118,540.66
- Projects include (so far):
 - Housing and homelessness efforts including portions of the Cares Campus and site enhancements to Our Place
 - Updates to courtrooms to allow for increased remote hearings post-pandemic and increased ADA compliance
 - **Public health and human services** including child protective services and at-risk youth
 - Public safety services





Community Reinvestment Grant Program



\$4 million available

for eligible nonprofits providing service to Washoe County community members.

Small Grant	Standard Grant
 Up to \$50,000 to support smaller projects or one-time purchases. 12-month performance period No match requirement Limited to one grant per organization 	 \$50,001 to \$1,000,000 12–24-month performance period No match requirement Limited to one grant per organization.

Organizations are eligible for either a small grant or a standard grant and will only be awarded one type of grant.



Grant Program Purpose


- Achieve equitable outcomes and serve underserved populations,
- Aid households or populations facing negative economic or public health impacts caused or exacerbated by the COVID-19 public health emergency,
- **Build stronger communities** through housing and neighborhood services including recreational opportunities,
- Promote healthy childhood environments such as afterschool programs or services,
- Improve **access to healthcare**, behavioral healthcare, substance abuse services, or mental health services,
- Promote evidence-based interventions in the community.





Ineligible Activities

- Proposals for general economic development
- Construction of stadiums or tourist destinations will not be considered
- Proposed projects should not be used to escalate overhead expenses
- Anything ineligible outlined in Treasury's Final Rule





Applicant Eligibility

- State of Nevada Certificate of Existence with Status of Good Standing
- Nonprofit certificate 501(c)(3) or 501(c)(19)
- Provide direct services to the Washoe County community
- Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) <u>active</u> SAM.gov registration

Once final proposals are chosen, your organization must provide certificate of insurance and a list of your current board of directors.

In accordance with NRS 244.1505, the Board of County Commissioners may grant all or part of the money to a nonprofit organization created for religious, charitable or educational purposes to be expended for the selected purpose.

Reporting and Management

- Grants are subject to 2 CFR 200 Uniform Guidance requirements
- Quarterly Financial and Activity Reporting will be required for all awardees due 10 days after the close of the quarter
 - Activity Report Brief status update on project progress
 - Financial Report Detailed financial reports are required to submit for draw requests for reimbursement of allocable activities.
- Single Audit
 - Recipients and subrecipients that expend more than \$750,000 in Federal awards during their fiscal year will be subject to an audit.
 - This includes if you received federal award money from other awarding agencies


