


What is One Nevada?

The One Nevada planning process helps the Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) meet current and future transportation needs. One Nevada provides a foundation for making more informed, data-driven, transparent, and responsive transportation investment decisions. One Nevada is built on the following six critical goals.



The One Nevada process is split into three groupings:



Need: An issue or concern. A defined need will typically advance into a plan or study, using data and community input to understand why the need exists.


Concept: A proposed solution to solve identified needs in a specific location.

Project: An engineered solution to identified needs. During this last phase, projects are designed, right-of-way is acquired, and funding is allocated to complete construction.

HOW IS A PROJECT DEVELOPED?

When priority projects are identified through One Nevada, they begin to advance through the project development process. Projects that will be constructed within the next four years must be included in the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Because NDOT must ensure funding is in place and follow state and federal requirements, projects often take multiple years to complete. The length of time to deliver a project varies according to its size and complexity.

WHAT IS THE ROLE OF NDOT DISTRICTS?



Depending on funding and collaboration with other agencies, full project development process may take 10+ years
