

Each new incident is assigned a unique identifier. The statistics below reflect the number of incidents TMFR responded to within your CAB (regardless of jurisdiction).



Incident Count	Daily Average
201	6.5

*Unit Responses	Daily Average
349	11.3

\*Many incidents require multiple resources to respond to the scene. **Unit Responses** reflects every unit response to an incident.

*Example: A fire incident dispatches 3 Engines, 1 Ladder Truck, 1 Ambulance, and 2 Battalion Chiefs = 7 unit response.*

### Safety Tips & Updates

- Blocked hydrants can delay critical response during a fire emergency. Take the time to remove snow and other debris around fire hydrants near your home. It will make a real difference.
- Sleep with your bedroom door closed. A simple hollow-core door will keep your bedroom around 100 degrees, while the hall just outside is 900 degrees. The extra 10 or 15 minutes that door will give you is enough time for the hall smoke detector to wake you up and for you to get out.
- Winter often means using fireplaces and space heaters, all of which can increase the risk of carbon monoxide poisoning. Don't wait. Test your Carbon Monoxide alarms today and make sure they're working.
