

#### Monthly Incident Total: 201

Each new incident is assigned a unique identifier. The statistics below reflects the number of incidents TMFR responded to within your CAB (regardless of jurisdiction).



Incident Count	Daily Average
201	6.5

*Unit Responses	Daily Average
349	11.3

\*Many incidents require multiple resources to respond to the scene. **Unit Responses** reflects every unit response to an incident.

*Example: A fire incident dispatches 3 Engines, 1 Ladder Truck, 1 Ambulance, and 2 Battalion Chiefs = 7 unit response.*

Statistics above are unaudited, and incident types are presented as they were dispatched. The outcome of the incidents may differ from the initial dispatch reason.

#### Safety Tips & Updates

- Space Heater Safety:** Never use extension cords or leave heaters unattended. Always maintain a 3 foot clearance around them and unplug them when not in use.
- Carbon Monoxide:** Use of fireplaces and furnaces creates carbon monoxide (CO). It is a colorless and odorless gas that can have deadly consequences. Ensure detectors are installed in living spaces and test them monthly.
- Electronic Device Charging:** Always use the supplied charging cords and inspect batteries for damage before plugging in. Never charge while on a bed, sofa, or other soft surface. Devices need space to dissipate heat buildup during charging.
