

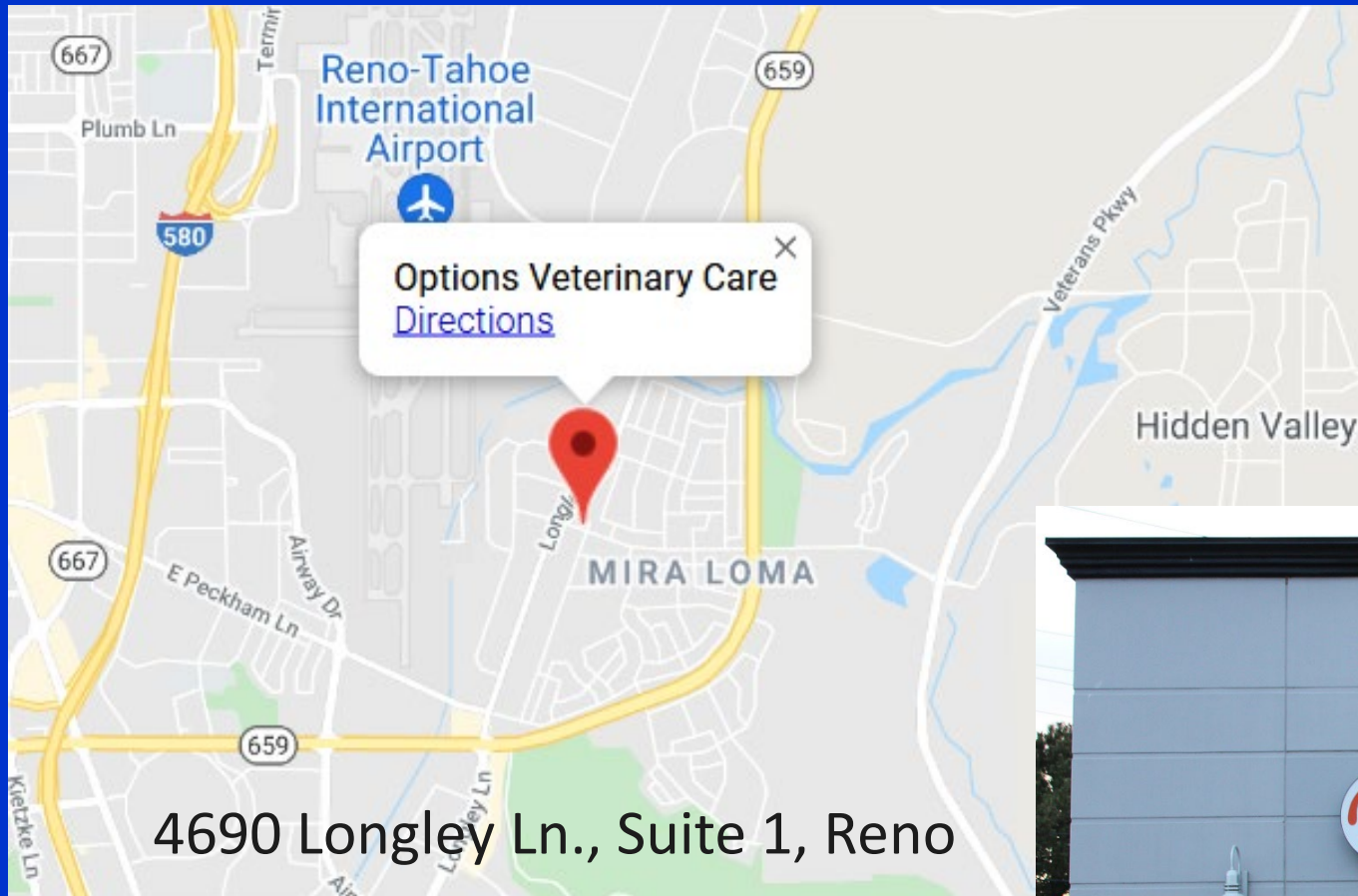

- Dental care

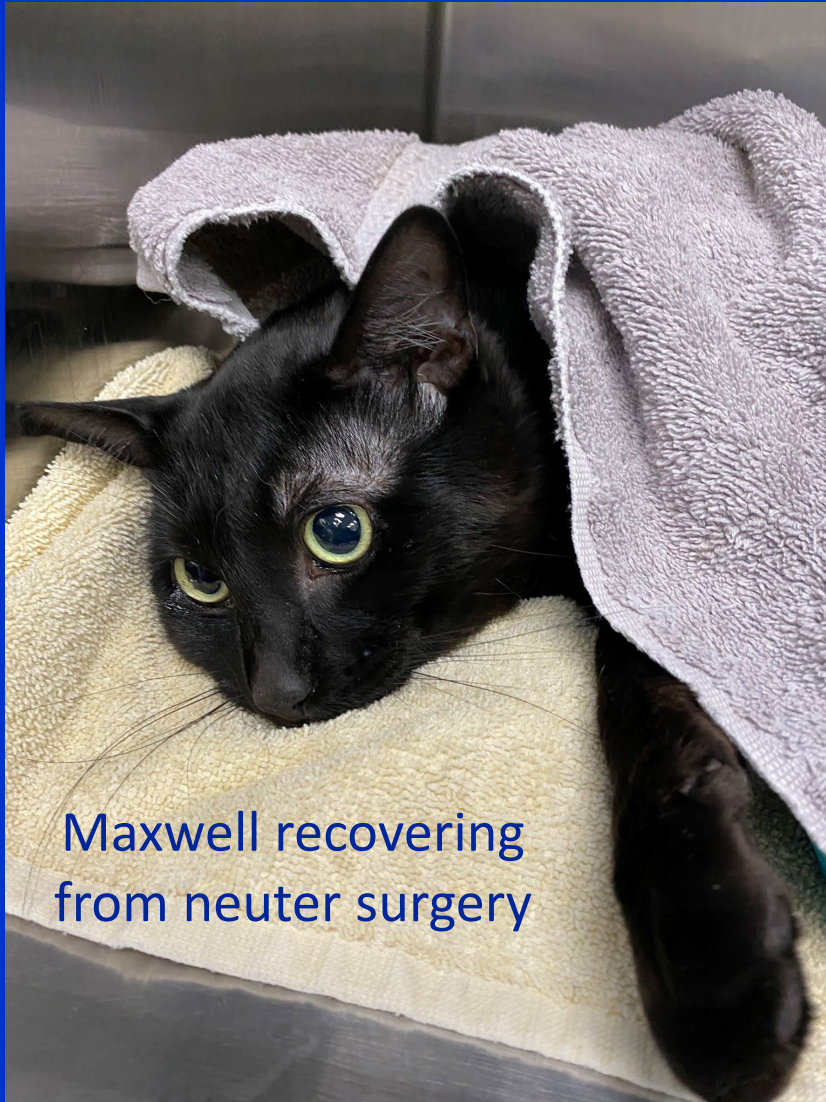
Animals:

Thank you to Washoe County for including Options in public spay/neuter funding from ARPA funds and to WCRAS for supporting spay/neuter efforts.

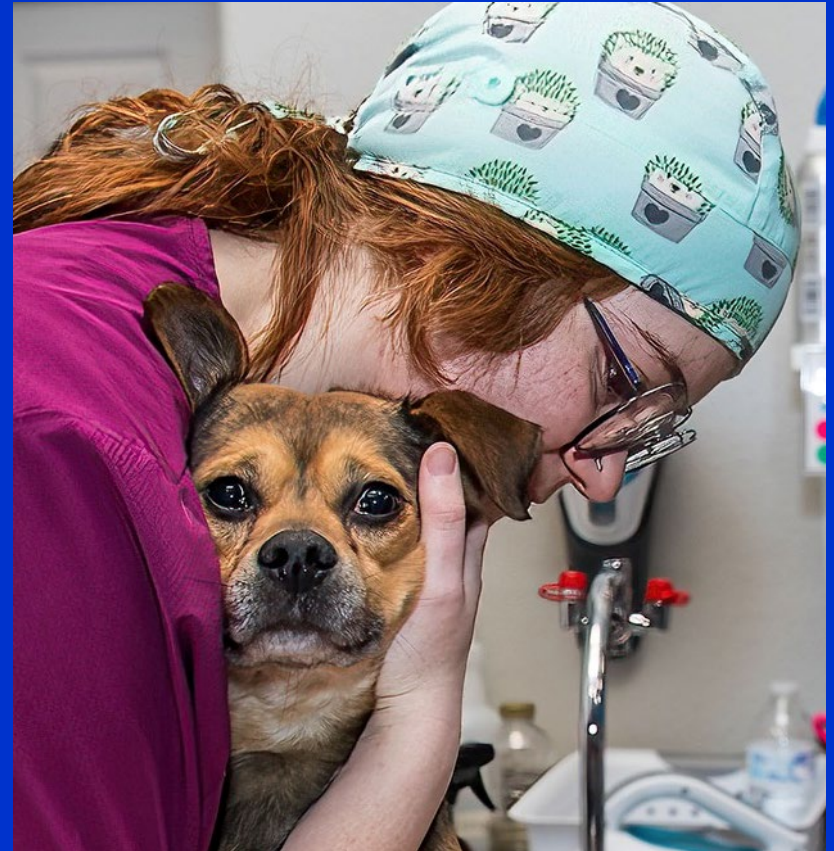

Options Veterinary Care

How we are using these funds:

- Free TNR spay/neuter surgery for cats trapped in Washoe County
- Free spay/neuter for rescue groups that pull from WCRAS
- Affordable and free spay/neuter for Washoe County pet owners



Options Veterinary Care

Since the funding was awarded Dec. 10, 2024 through April 30, 2025 Options has performed 1,634 spay/neuter surgeries.

623 of these surgeries will be covered by Washoe County ARPA funds.

Total spay/neuter includes out of county animals, those funded by the SPCA-NN voucher program, or fully paid by the pet owner.



Options Veterinary Care

February Spay Neuter Awareness Month

Joint effort of Options Veterinary Care, SPCA of Northern Nevada and Washoe County Regional Animal Services.

Together, these organizations exceeded their goal of 500 surgeries in February with a total of 542 dogs and cats being fixed.

383 of these surgeries were performed at Options.

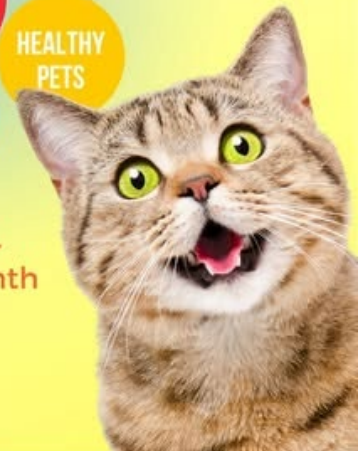

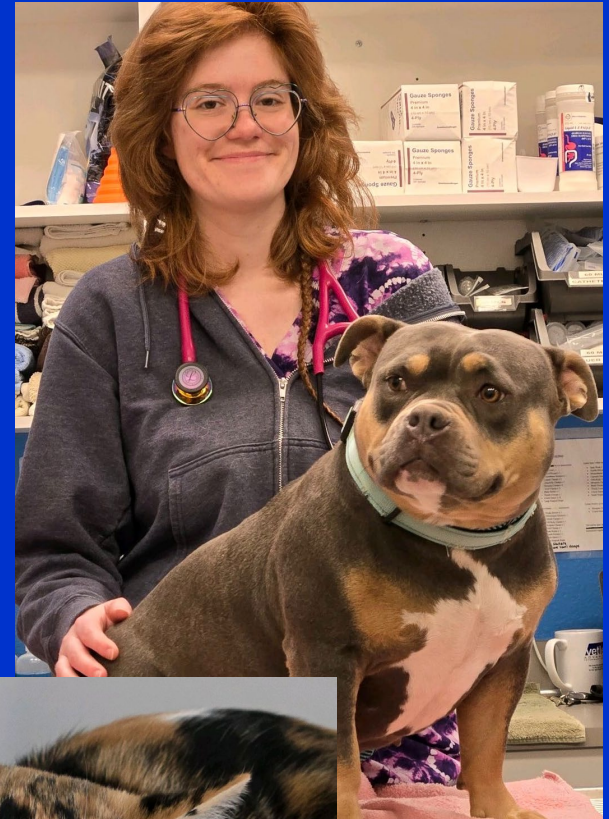
