95-757 NEVADA HEALTH CARE COALITION - RISK MANAGEMENT

Ray Sibley, Risk Manager, reviewed background information and answered questions of the Board concerning Washoe County's participation in the Nevada Health Care Coalition.

Following discussion, upon recommendation of Ray Sibley, Risk Manager, on motion by Commissioner Bond, seconded by Commissioner Bradhurst, which motion duly carried, Chairman Shaw ordered that Washoe County participate in incorporation of the Nevada Health Care Coalition; and that the Risk Manager be appointed as the County's representative in this regard.

95-758 MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT - SHERIFF

Upon recommendation of Richard Kirkland, Sheriff, on motion by Commissioner Bond, seconded by Commissioner Mouliot, which motion duly carried, it was ordered that a Mutual Aid Agreement between the County of Washoe (Sheriff) and the County of Humboldt (Sheriff), concerning furnishing law enforcement personnel, resources and facilities as may be necessary for the good of the citizens of Washoe and Humboldt Counties, be approved and Chairman Shaw be authorized to execute.

95-759 SEWER SERVICE AGREEMENT - HAWCO INVESTMENT AND DEVELOPMENT COMPANY, INC. AND NORTH SPRINGS ESTATES, LTD. - UTILITY

Dave Roundtree, Regional Water Manager, reviewed background information contained in a staff report dated August 2, 1995 and summarized a Sewer Service Agreement between Washoe County, HAWCO Investment Development Company, North Springs Estates, Ltd., regarding sewer service in the Spanish Springs Valley and answered concerns raised by the Board regarding financing mechanisms, debt service, lease payments, the cost of hauling and pumping sewage, and interim sewer service provided to new residential customers who previously have been issued certificates of occupancy. Mr. Roundtree further explained that the ability to provide interim sewer service is contingent upon the District Health Department granting a variance with conditions that would be acceptable to all parties.

Commissioner Mouliot expressed concern regarding the ability of individual sewage haulers to haul an estimated 7,000 gallons of sewage per truck load emphasizing the need for a backup system. Mr. Roundtree explained that these concerns could be addressed in a contract with the hauler; that costs will be outlined in the contract; and that language will be included in the contract to specify equipment, which will include backup equipment.

Bob Sader, representing HAWCO Investment and Development Company, addressed issues regarding speculation that favoritism is being

granted to certain developers in Spanish Springs. He explained that presently there are four developers in the Spanish Springs Valley; that HAWCO owns the majority of land under the existing master plan; that other developers include North Springs Estates, the Tucker land and the Neuffer Development; that favoritism is not being granted to anyone as they are all bound by this agreement; and that he is very comfortable that there will be sufficient sewage treatment capacity to serve the entire area.

Following discussion, on motion by Commissioner Bond, seconded by Commissioner Bradhurst, which motion duly carried, it was ordered that a Sewer Interceptor Agreement between Washoe County, HAWCO Investment and Development Co., and North Springs Estates, LTD., be approved with the stipulation that there are a sufficient number of trucks to administer the hauling of sewage; and that the agreement be contingent upon a variance granted by the District Health Board with conditions acceptable to all parties.

95-760 ACKNOWLEDGMENT, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND COVENANT NOT TO SUE AND AGREEMENT - NORTH LAKE TAHOE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT
