03-669 <u>AGENDA</u>

In accordance with the Open Meeting Law, on motion by Commissioner Shaw, seconded by Commissioner Galloway, which motion duly carried with Commissioners Weber and Sferrazza absent, Chairman Humke ordered that the agenda for the June 17, 2003 meeting be approved.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Sam Dehne, local resident, expressed his views on Burning Man, loud motorcycles and the taxes being considered by the Legislature.

Garth Elliott, area resident, spoke in support of the Burning Man event.

*<u>1:13 p.m.</u> Commissioner Sferrazza arrived at the meeting.

Neal Cobb, area resident, stated he has been before the Board on five previous occasions requesting that the speeding and dust problems by off-road vehicles be addressed. When the issue was finally presented to the Sign Committee, that group decided an education program would work better. Mr. Cobb pleaded with the Board to urge the Sign Committee to reconsider, stating traffic signs are the best education because otherwise people do not know they are breaking the law.

MANAGER'S/COMMISSIONERS' COMMENTS

Commissioner Shaw requested that an item to reconsider the Board's appointee to the Washoe County Airport Authority be placed on the next possible agenda.

Commissioner Sferrazza requested a future agenda item to address the signage issue in Golden Valley with respect to dust, speed control and off-road vehicles brought up by Mr. Cobb. He further stated, if staff could just take care of the problem, he would request a report to the Board concerning the matter. Commissioner Sferrazza also indicated he could not support Commissioner Shaw's request, but would support a personnel session on the issue.

Commissioner Galloway requested a future agenda item concerning proliferation of unauthorized signage, billboards, illegal banners, etc.

Upon recommendation of Mike Capello, Social Services Director, on motion by Commissioner Galloway, seconded by Commissioner Sferrazza, which motion duly carried with Commissioner Weber absent, it was ordered that the #2 Amendment to the Contract between the County of Washoe and the State of Nevada Department of Human Resources, Division of Child and Family Services, concerning extension of the contract regarding integration of State and County Child Welfare Services from June 30, 2003 to July 31, 2003, be approved and Chairman Humke be authorized to execute the same.

03-679 <u>ARTOWN - 2003</u>

Tom Outland, Chairman of the Board, Artown, displayed a picture of a painting that is being used for the Artown 2003 logo. Mr. Outland listed the scheduled events, the artists and the performances that will be occurring during the month of July and displayed pictures of last year's events on the overhead screen. He said ticket sales are going very well, and the Baryshnikov performance has already sold out.

Board members congratulated Mr. Outland for the success of Artown and for bringing this national recognition to the area.

Garth Elliott, Sun Valley resident, commended Artown for bringing world-class art to Reno. He asked what Washoe County is doing for the local artists and stated the home business license laws need to be revised to accommodate the struggling artists working out of their homes.

Sam Dehne, Reno resident, stated Artown is not free and the citizens pay the vast majority for these events through their taxes.

Kathy Carter, Community Relations Director, read the names of the Washoe County employees who volunteered their time to assist at the conference and stated the employees were very good representatives for Washoe County. Commissioner Galloway expressed his appreciation to the volunteers and read the names of the organizations that donated funds to help make the conference a success. Commissioner Shaw reported that he attended another conference a week later where other County Commissioners were still talking about what a wonderful time they had at Rancho San Rafael. Commissioner Sferrazza said another person that needs to be acknowledged for her hard work is Kathy Carter, and he thanked her for her efforts. Chairman Humke also expressed his appreciation to staff.

03-681 <u>CONTRACT – ENGINEERING SERVICES – COLD SPRINGS</u> WATER RECLAMATION FACILITY - WATER RESOURCES

Upon recommendation of John Collins, Utility Services Manager, and Paul Orphan, Engineering Manager, through Steve Bradhurst, Water Resources Director, on motion by Commissioner Shaw, seconded by Commissioner Galloway, which motion duly carried with Commissioner Weber absent, it was ordered that an engineering contract between the County of Washoe and Kennedy/Jenks Consultants for the design of the Cold Springs Water Reclamation Facility expansion and the Cold Springs Diamond Peak Lift Station upgrade, in the amount of \$1,064,676, be approved and Chairman Humke be authorized to execute the same.

03-682 <u>COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT – CANEPA RANCH – U.S.</u> <u>FOREST SERVICE – PARKS</u>

Karen Mullen, Parks and Recreation Director, advised staff is seeking approval to negotiate a cooperative agreement with the United States Forest Service (USFS) concerning exchanging a portion of the Canepa Ranch property for water rights. She said staff's goal is to keep the trailhead lands and the access areas, which would be approximately 10 acres of the ± 120 acres owned by the County, and exchange the areas closest to the USFS lands for water rights held by the USFS. Ms. Mullen displayed maps of the subject property on the overhead screen.

Commissioner Galloway asked if the County would retain the trail easement over USFS land. Ms. Mullen stated the County would be keeping the trailhead area and the easement for the trail access. Commissioner Galloway asked if staff is seeking as much input as possible so they can be sure they also reserve what might be needed for any future plans. Ms. Mullen stated they would be sure to include some broad conditions to allow for the future. She described the areas on the map the County plans to keep and stated, as far as an equal value exchange, they would not know the value until the land is appraised; and that will determine exactly how much land is exchanged. Ms. Mullen stated Washoe County would retain the lands closest to the river.

Commissioner Galloway commented on the Forest Service closing the Seventh Street pits and asked that staff keep that in mind when negotiating this agreement.

Commissioner Sferrazza expressed a concern that selling the water rights would facilitate development in the Galena area that might not otherwise occur. He

stated it appears to be more of a pro-development issue than preserving open space and he is not sure that fits with the intent of the bonds. Ms. Mullen stated she does not believe there is a problem as long as the money from the sale of the water rights is specifically used to acquire additional property on the Truckee River.

Steve Kluge, USFS, stated the Forest Service does not have a sale authority for water rights, so they have been looking for a way to capitalize on these water rights, which they acquired through another land transaction. Commissioner Sferrazza asked if the USFS could use the water rights on Forest Service land. Mr. Kluge stated they have not been able to identify a public purpose for their use; and, if they are not put to use, the water rights, and their value to the public, will be lost.

Commissioner Galloway asked if the property would be deed restricted so that it must remain in public ownership with Washoe County as the beneficiary to the deed restriction. Mr. Kluge stated he would need to take that question to the USFS legal counsel.

Ms. Mullen stated, if the County does not do this exchange, the USFS would put the water rights out to bid for an exchange of land elsewhere, which could be anywhere in the country. She felt it was important to keep the money locally.

Upon recommendation of Ms. Mullen, on motion by Commissioner Galloway, seconded by Commissioner Shaw, which motion duly carried with Commissioner Weber absent, it was ordered that Washoe County Parks staff prepare a cooperative agreement for future Board approval delineating an exchange of approximately 110.66 acres of County owned Canepa Ranch property for equal value in water rights held by the USFS, subject to following conditions:

1. The property would remain in public ownership with the USFS.

2. An easement for the Truckee River bike path would be established.

3. All money from the County sale of the water rights would be

returned to the WC-1 Bond account used to purchase land along the Truckee River and to make public access improvements as stated in the original voter approved Bond.

03-683 <u>AWARD OF BID – 2003/04 STREET CUT PAVEMENT REPAIR</u> <u>PROJECT, INCLINE VILLAGE - BID NO. PWP-WA-2003-104 –</u> <u>PUBLIC WORKS</u>

This was the time to consider award of bid for the 2003/04 Street Cut Pavement Repair Project, Incline Village Area, for the Public Works Department. The Notice to Bidders for receipt of sealed bids was published in the *Reno Gazette-Journal* on May 7, 14, and 29, 2003. Proof was made that due and legal Notice had been given.

Upon recommendation of David Price, County Engineer, through Tom Gadd, Public Works Director, on motion by Commissioner Galloway, seconded by Commissioner Shaw, which motion duly carried with Commissioner Weber absent, it was ordered that the bid for 2003/04 Street Cut Pavement Repair Project, Incline Village Area, for the Public Works Department be awarded to the low bidder, Lakeside Paving, in the base bid estimated amount of \$159,800 and Chairman Humke be authorized to execute the agreement when presented.

03-684 RENEWAL OF CONTRACT – INTERMOUNTAIN SLURRY SEAL, INC. – 2003/04 SLURRY SEAL PROJECT - PUBLIC WORKS

Commissioner Sferrazza asked if any General Fund monies are being used to pay for the slurry seal projects. Katy Singlaub, County Manager, stated the funding is a combination of General Fund money and fuel taxes. Commissioner Sferrazza stated he could not support the recommendation if Washoe County General Funds are being used and there are no street improvements in the incorporated areas.

John Mayer, Sparks citizen, stated there is \$2.6-million for this program and not one road or street to be sealed is in Sparks or Reno. He stated he picked 11 streets from the list and compared them to Gandolfo Way in Sparks, and not one of the 11 was as bad as Gandolfo Way. The City of Sparks has a \$47-million backlog of street maintenance. Mr. Mayer stated all residents are citizens of the County and the issue of repairing the roads should be Countywide. He stated 37 percent of his taxes go to Washoe County, while 26 percent goes to the City of Sparks; and it would only be fair and just to spread street maintenance out equally between the unincorporated and incorporated areas.

Will Brown, Spanish Springs resident, stated this issue was discussed and argued about a great deal during the fiscal equity discussions. He cited numerous areas concerning fiscal equity between the entities and stated the whole picture has to be examined, not just one area.

Commissioner Sferrazza requested a workshop on this issue and stated he was not talking about fiscal equity, but what he wanted to see in the street maintenance program was District equity.

Commissioner Shaw advised the Regional Transportation Commission (RTC) is going to be providing some funds for a sealing program in Reno and Sparks. Tom Gadd, Public Works Director, stated the RTC is going to be distributing \$1.7-million towards a slurry seal and overlay program that will cover both the unincorporated and incorporated areas. He stated there is a meeting on June 18, 2003 to discuss the distribution of the funds.

Upon recommendation of David Price, County Engineer, through Tom Gadd, Public Works Director, on motion by Commissioner Galloway, seconded by Commissioner Shaw, which motion duly carried with Commissioner Sferrazza voting "no" and Commissioner Weber absent, it was ordered that the subject contract with Intermountain Slurry Seal, Inc., be renewed for the 2003/04 Slurry Seal of Selected Streets in Washoe County project in the amount of \$1,322,487.87 (PWP-WA-2003-152). It was further ordered that Chairman Humke be authorized to execute the contract documents when presented.

03-685 <u>LEASE PAYMENT AGREEMENT – HUMANE SOCIETY –</u> <u>PUBLIC WORKS</u>

Upon recommendation of Tom Gadd, Public Works Director, on motion by Commissioner Sferrazza, seconded by Commissioner Shaw, which motion duly carried with Commissioner Weber absent, it was ordered that a Lease Payment Agreement between Washoe County and the Nevada Humane Society concerning repayment of financing the construction of and supplemental lease payments for space to be occupied by the Nevada Humane Society for the Regional Animal Services Shelter be approved and Chairman Humke be authorized to execute the same. It was further ordered that the form of the Lease Agreement attached to the Lease Payment Agreement also be approved.

It was noted the Humane Society has agreed to pay 10 semi-annual payments sufficient to repay the County's \$2.575-million medium-term bond issue, and the Lease Payment Agreement also permits the County to lease space to the Nevada Humane Society for an additional 20 years at the Humane Society's option. It was also noted that it is anticipated the Humane Society will make supplemental lease payments sufficient to pay the operational and maintenance expenses of the leased space.

03-686 <u>2002 REGIONAL PLAN SETTLEMENTS</u>

Adrian Freund, Director, Department of Community Development, reported there was a hearing before the Regional Planning Commission (RPC) regarding the differences between the criteria and development standards adopted by Washoe County versus those adopted by the Cities of Reno and Sparks; and the result was the RPC did agree it was preferable to have one set of criteria; however, the criteria they voted to adopt was that of the Cities. He stated staff is requesting direction as to whether or not to appeal that decision to the Regional Planning Governing Board (RPGB).

Commissioner Galloway relayed what occurred at the last RPGB meeting. He moved that staff be directed to file the appeal because that way each item will be addressed one-by-one. Commissioner Sferrazza seconded the motion.

Gary Schmidt, Washoe County resident and co-litigant in the Regional Plan Update, stated he whole-heartedly supports the County moving forward with the appeal.

Chairman Humke called for the vote, and the motion carried unanimously with Commissioner Weber absent.
