
### Legislative Authority – NRS 379

- \_\_\_\_.002: The "goal of the State's publicly supported libraries . . . [is] to provide the resources and trained staff to meet the informational needs of all citizens."
- \_\_\_\_.010: Enables the board of county commissioners to "set apart an amount of money for the purpose of operating and maintaining [a public] library."
- \_\_\_\_.020: The board of county commissioners "shall appoint five competent persons who are residents of the county to serve as county library trustees."
- \_\_\_\_.025-026, .040: Powers and duties of library trustees hire the director, approve public hours and policies, submit annual budgets, oversee gift funds.


