#### **SUMMARY**

Staff requests that the Board of Commissioners approves the appended proclamation designating October 18-24, 2015 as Friends of Libraries Week.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Association of Library Trustees, Advocates, Friends and Foundations—also known as United for Libraries—sponsors National Friends of Libraries week every year during the third full week of October, as a way of promoting library Friends groups.

Friends of Washoe County Library (FWCL) is a 501 (c) (3) non-profit organization, incorporated in January 1981 and currently boasting over 750 members dedicated to advocating, fundraising and providing support for the Washoe County Library System. Its mission is to strengthen public libraries in Washoe County. Through its ventures, FWCL strives to give children an educational head start, encourage all forms of literacy and foster lifelong learning and recreation for adults. Over the past 34 years, the Friends of Washoe County Library, through its community projects and fundraising efforts, has raised close to \$3,000,000 for the Washoe County Library System. These supplemental

funds directly support free library programs, enhance library technology and equipment, provide gift funds for library materials and augment marketing and training endeavors, benefiting the entire Truckee Meadows. The Friends operate the Secondhand Prose Bookstore within the Northwest Reno Library, and generate additional financial support from membership dues, monetary donations, and by managing voluminous book donations for book-sales which take place in their Reno Town Mall location.
