Declaration of Canvass of Vote and Order for 2016 Primary Election

(All Commission Districts.)

SUMMARY

Per NRS 293.387, the Board of County Commissioners shall canvass the vote of the June 14, 2016 Primary Election. (All Commission Districts)

BACKGROUND

NRS 293.387 requires the board of county commissioners to canvass the returns from elections held in the county. During this public meeting, the board has the opportunity for a review of the election results and the opportunity to note errors within the election results. After the board is satisfied it can declare the result presented represents the true vote cast. After the returns are canvassed, the board has the duty to direct the Washoe County Registrar of Voters to enter upon the records of the county an abstract of the result containing the number of votes cast for each candidate and to have the registrar certify the abstract. Approving the attached order satisfies that duty.

Washoe County Board of County Commissioners Declaration of Canvass of Vote and Order

WHEREAS, an election was held in Washoe County on June 14, 2016;

WHEREAS, the Washoe County Board of County Commissioners has convened a duly noticed public meeting on June 21, 2016 to canvass the vote of that election;

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to NRS 293 of the Nevada Revised Statutes and NRS 293.032 and NRS 293.387 in particular, the Washoe County Board of County Commissioners determines, declares and orders as follows:

- 1. A review of the election results has been made by which any errors within the election results, if there were any, could be officially noted.
- 2. No clerical errors were discovered from the canvass and no resulting changes in the vote are necessary.
- 3. The official election results are hereby declared and the result declared represents the true votes cast.
- 4. The Washoe County Registrar of Voters is directed to enter upon the record of the Board an abstract of the results containing the number of votes cast for each candidate and shall certify the abstract.
- 5. Pursuant to this order hereby entered in the minutes of the Board, the Registrar shall copy the certified abstract and make a mechanized report of the abstract in compliance with regulations adopted by the Secretary of State and transmit them to the Secretary of State within seven working days after the election.



All of the Edge Voting Machines listed were audited by the Accuracy Certification Board (ACB) on Friday, June 17. The VVPAT Audit (NAC 293.255) requires that at least 20 Voting Machine's Paper Audit Trails be reviewed. Our ACB chose to audit 25. This is done by scanning the barcode on the bottom of each voter's copy of his votes. Those are totaled and compared to the print-out from the voting machine cartridge. The ACB also reviews at least two sets of votes visually and compares to make certain the barcode at the bottom of each voter's choices is being accurately reflected. No errors were found.

New Legislation

SB 499 Major party has two or more candidates for an office, must be a primary election regardless of whether there are any minor political party or independent candidates for the office – new law applied to two races in Washoe County

AB 94 Sample Ballot opt-out begins – soft launch for Primary Election – system worked well

 Long-term this will be a tremendous opportunity for cost and environmental savings





WHAT'S NEXT?

- NOVEMBER 8, 2016 GENERAL ELECTION
 - Expect close to record turn-out
 - Highest to date in 1980 85%
 - More focus on security and educating poll workers about what to watch for
 - More "zen" training tips for handling observers
