SUBJECT:	Recommendation to appoint one of Washoe County's members to the Truckee River Fund Advisory Committee [staff recommends Brian Bonnenfant]. (All Commission Districts.)

SUMMARY

The Truckee River Fund is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit agency that is operated by the Community Foundation of Western Nevada, funded by Truckee Meadows Water Authority (TMWA) rate payers and established for the sole purpose of funding projects that protect and enhance water quality or water resources of the Truckee River or its watershed.

A nine member Advisory Committee reviews and makes recommendations on project proposals. The cities of Reno and Sparks and Washoe County each appoint three members of the Committee. Members do not serve established terms, but rather "at the pleasure of their respective local governments." One of Washoe County's appointees, Sue Donaldson, has recently resigned. Other Washoe County appointees currently serving are Susan Lynn (appointed in 2014) and Don Mahin (appointed in 2016).

Ms. Tracy Turner of the Community Foundation of Western Nevada contacted Washoe County and indicated the need for a Washoe County appointee to replace Ms. Donaldson. The Washoe County Community Services Department advertised in the Reno Gazette Journal on February 17, 2017, posted the vacancy on Washoe County's Citizen Involvement webpage and sent a C-mail to residents signed up to receive such notifications. These efforts resulted in five letters of interest/resumes.

The letters of interest and resumes were reviewed by the Director of the Community Services Department for recommendation to the Board of County Commissioners (Board).

Washoe County Strategic Objective supported by this item: Stewardship of Our Community.



PREVIOUS ACTION

On May 10, 2016, the Board appointed Don Mahin to replace Jerry Purdy on the Truckee River Fund Advisory Committee.

On June 17, 2014, the Board appointed Susan Lynn to replace John Mosley on the Truckee River Fund Advisory Committee.

April 14, 2009, the Board appointed Sue Donaldson to replace Susan Lynn on the Truckee River Fund Advisory Committee.

On June 10, 2008, the Board appointed John Mosley to replace Daryl Gardipe on the Truckee River Fund Advisory Committee.

On September 14, 2004, the Board appointed Susan Lynn, Arlan Melendez, and Jerry Purdy to the Truckee River Fund Advisory Committee.

BACKGROUND

The Truckee River Fund is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit agency that is operated by the Community Foundation of Western Nevada, funded by TMWA rate payers and established for the sole purpose of funding projects that protect and enhance water quality or water resources of the Truckee River or its watershed. General duties of the Advisory Committee are to make recommendations to the TMWA Board and Foundation Board regarding distributions of income and principal from the Fund to potential charitable beneficiaries and any other aspects of the administration of the Fund as considered appropriate by the Advisory Committee.

The Advisory Committee meets at least quarterly to conduct Fund business, review and update the requests for proposal and/or review project proposals prior to funding meetings and selects potential projects for funding. Projects must be in compliance with the exclusive purposes of the Fund and the Community Foundation's policies and has the responsibility of securing preliminary approval from the TMWA Board, has the responsibility of seeing final approval from the Foundation Board and reviews project reports and reports to the Advisory Committee on the progress of funded projects. The Advisory Committee reviews accountings for the Fund at least annually.

Staff of the Community Services Department actively recruited for this position through newspaper advertisements and posting on the County's website, receiving five applications including Mr. Bonnenfant's. The other applicants are listed below: Christopher Campos Richard Molezzo Patrick Morton Ron Penrose – subsequently appointed by the City of Sparks

Staff reviewed the resumes and letters of interest of all applicants and is recommending Mr. Brian Bonnenfant to the Board for appointment. Mr. Brian Bonnenfant has a long standing relationship with the Truckee River, and that coupled with his natural resources studies make him a strong advocate for the Truckee River. Mr. Bonnenfant currently sits on the Board of Trustees of the Nevada Land Trust, a partner with Washoe County, and the community for the One Truckee River initiative.

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FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact associated with Washoe County's making appointments to or participating in the Truckee River Fund Advisory Committee.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended the Board of County Commissioners appoint one of Washoe County's members to the Truckee River Fund Advisory Committee [staff recommends Brian Bonnenfant].

POSSIBLE MOTION

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Should the Board agree with staff's recommendation, a possible motion would be: "Move to appoint Brian Bonnenfant as one of Washoe County's appointees to the Truckee River Fund Advisory Committee."

RE: Letter of Interest – Truckee River Fund Advisory Committee

My history/connection to the Truckee River begins in 1874 when my great-grandfather (Harry Riley) was born on Poore's Ranch which is now Idlewild Park. I was also born and raised in Reno and attended parks & rec summer programs at Idlewild Park (where I learned to swim) while living on California Avenue. As a teenager I ironically moved to my great-grandfather's house on Flint Street (next to Lake Street Mansion), which now houses the Pignic Pub & Patio. While living downtown I would fish the Truckee every morning in the summer (the freezer was always stocked with trout), and then "body float" from a cousin's house on the river back to downtown.

Upon graduating Reno High I enlisted in the military and then off to Chico State for my undergraduate degree in Geology. After nine years of seeing the world and a lot of California, I returned to Reno as a gold-exploration geologist. Years later, I enrolled at UNR as a graduate student in geological engineering and helped create a geographic information systems (GIS) entity for the Nevada State Demographer Office. The entity is now called Center for Regional Studies where I am the project manager.

When buying our first house I choose a neighborhood with quick access to the river (old southwest Reno), which served as the usual go-to for bike rides, tennis with my daughter (Barbara Bennett Park), and events held in Wingfield Park. Over the years, I have explored many stretches of the river between Lake Tahoe and Pyramid Lake.

Although my work at the University involves research and analyses targeted at economic development, I have an educational background in science, specifically in natural resources. As part of my geologic curriculum, I enrolled in undergraduate and graduate classes in hydrology, hydraulics, and geo-hydrology. I am currently on the Board of Trustees for Nevada Land Trust (NLT), and was on the search committee for the One Truckee River (OTR) Phase I RFP. I continue to attend advisory meetings for OTR as part of my NLT function.

My history, education, and passion related to the Truckee River has been a life-long experience. In light of the continuous challenges to the Truckee River (flooding, water quality, sustainable ecosystem, recreation, etc.), I hope to provide guidance to its stewardship using the skills I have learned in my journeys.

He also completed case studies of the water treatment impacts from an extreme natural event and the TMWA Infrastructure Survey and Needs Assessment. This information will be provided to NDEP and the EPA in support of state revolving fund loans for capital improvement projects.

> Glendale Water Supply Improvement Project: Project Manager. Mr. Penrose directed this successful project involving the replacement of TMWA's Truckee River water diversion to the Glendale Water Treatment Plant in Sparks. He managed a project team involved in all aspects of the project including an extensive stakeholder public process, permitting at the Federal, State and local level, project design and construction. The design effort included a physical model used to confirm design criteria for the project. Completion of the project has improved the reliability and capacity of the Glendale Plant as well as providing environmental, fishery, flood, recreational and public safety benefits to the river system and community. Mr. Penrose worked with the TMWA management team and consultants to secure potential Federal funding through a Water Resource Development Act (WRDA) authorization from the USACE.

> Highland Canal Improvement Project: Project Manager. Mr. Penrose directed this multi-year project involving upgrades and capacity additions to TMWA's Highland Water Supply Canal. This canal is the primary source of Truckee River water to the Chalk Bluff Water Treatment Plant in northwest Reno. He managed a project team of hydraulic, design and environmental engineers in the development of a project master plan and subsequent implementation of the master plan through a multi-phased design/construction program. Activities also included the procurement of environmental permits, negotiations of rights-of-way including one with the Union Pacific Railroad, and negotiations with Washoe County officials which allowed for a portion of the old canal to be converted to a storm water control and drainage structure. This project is now complete providing the community with a near year-round gravity fed supply to the Chalk Bluff Water Treatment Plant. The project has reduced pumping costs by over \$.5 million per year and has removed public safety hazards associated with the previous canal system. Mr. Penrose also worked with TMWA's management team and State officials in the procurement of ARRA funds which helped reduce financing costs for the overall project.

> Truckee River Fund: Project Manager. Since 2004, Mr. Penrose has provided facilitation and coordination of TMWA's Truckee River Fund. The Truckee River Fund (TRF) was founded to provide TMWA a vehicle to support and encourage multi-jurisdictional projects that provide water

quality and watershed benefit to the Truckee River system. He provides input to the Fund Advisors from TMWA management and prepares and presents Board reports necessary for the funding of projects. Notable projects "to date" include funding for the Pioneer Ditch Diversion reconstruction project on the Truckee River, invasive species prevention programs for Lake Tahoe and the Truckee River system, DRI Cloud Seeding, and the Hawken Fire watershed restoration project. This TRF program essentially constitutes the surface water protection program.

TMWA Groundwater Protection Program: Lead Engineer. Mr. Penrose developed and implemented TMWA's Groundwater Protection Program. While managing the project, he procured a State grant covering the cost of program development and early implementation.

Sparks Groundwater Treatment Plant: Project Manager. Mr. Penrose managed and directed a project team of consultants and TMWA staff resulting in the successful conceptual design of a 15 MGD groundwater treatment plant in Sparks, Nevada. When eventually constructed, the plant will serve as an "off river" supply of potable water and as a peaking source. The plant will utilize manganese dioxide pressure filters for the removal of iron, manganese, and arsenic from local groundwater.

Expert Professional and Witness: TMWA management has utilized Mr. Penrose on a number of occasions as an expert witness in construction defect litigation and as TMWA's representative to local working groups on sensitive water and wastewater issues.

Backflow Prevention/Cross-Connection Control: Project Manager. Mr. Penrose developed and implemented Sierra Pacific's Backflow Prevention Program including the recruitment, training and supervision of technicians and support personnel. This work included the development and implementation of a backflow/cross-connection policy document resulting in a "State" approved and sanctioned program. While manager of this program, Mr. Penrose educated and trained large commercial account customers concerning their public health obligations and responsibility to establish their own "customer side" programs.

Water Treatment/Production Manager: Mr. Penrose recruited, trained, and managed a team of water treatment operators and technicians engaged in the operation of TMWA's (then Sierra Pacific Power Company) water treatment facilities. These efforts included Phase 1 start-up of the Chalk Bluff Water Plant and the initial decommissioning of older, noncompliant water treatment plants.

Engineering and Planning Supervisor- Gas and Water: Mr. Penrose recruited, trained, and managed a team of planning and design engineers, technicians, design draftsmen, and utility planners engaged in the planning and design of water treatment and gas and water distribution facilities and preparation of new business contracts. This work included the preparation of water treatment and gas and water distribution facility

master plans used for capital budgeting purposes. While in the position, Mr. Penrose oversaw the development of a water treatment compliance plan, which he later defended as an expert witness in regulatory hearings before the Nevada Public Utilities Commission. In the last PUCN rate case before Sierra's water division was sold, thus forming TMWA, Mr. Penrose acted as the chief "Plant and O & M" witness, resulting in a \$90 million dollar water plant rate base addition with little disallowance.

Superintendent- Gas and Water Operations: Mr. Penrose recruited, trained, and managed a team charged with operation and maintenance of Sierra's water distribution system, gas distribution system, and pressure control of the gas distribution system. While in this position, he managed emergency response measures during a major flood and a major gas pipeline rupture.
