

Ideas to utilize upcoming American Rescue Plan dollars

Through the passage of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (H.R. 1319), state and local aid will be distributed to States, local governments, and tribal governments in the same manner as Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF) from the CARES Act.

Funds are required to be spent within the following categories:

- Response to the public health emergency or its negative economic impacts
- Response to workers performing essential work during the public health emergency
- The provision of government services due to revenue reduction
- Make necessary investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure

Urgent Projects Under Review

Health - \$790,000

- Mobile Vaccination Clinic/Command Post (\$490,000)
- Improvements to Public Health Technology Infrastructure (\$300,000)

Sheriff - \$2,140,000

- UV lighting and sanitation tower (\$140,000)
- Touch Screens – Detention Facility (\$2,000,000)

Medical Examiner - \$190,000

- Lab supplies and equipment (\$50,000)
- Contractual Medical Pathologist (\$80,000)
- COVID Related OT & Intermittent staffing (\$60,000)



Urgent Projects Under Review

Human Services - \$1,436,000

- Our Place enhancements (landscape, fencing, repairs, etc.)((\$450,000)
- Our Place community garden fencing (\$130,000)
- Kids Kottage emergency beds for children in care (\$800,000)
- Vehicles for CPS to transport children in care (\$56,000)

Public Defender - \$1,302,289

- Staff to address case backlog/court closure (\$1,240,854)
- Office remodel for new staff (\$61,431)

District Court - \$2,285,000

- Enhanced Audio/Visual 75 Court St. (\$1,000,000)
- Audio/Visual Technician staff (\$285,000)
- Relocation of Family Peace Center (\$1,000,000)

Reno Justice Court - \$625,000

- Self-Help Resource Center CIP/FF&E (\$100,000)
- Legal Aid Self-help Center Contract (\$525,000)



Urgent Projects Under Review

Sparks Justice Court - \$234,100

- JAVS audio visual upgrade courtrooms 1/2/3 (\$132,000)
- Technology for remote hearings (\$102,200)

District Attorney - \$1,000,000

- Staff to address case backlog/court closure (\$1,000,000)


Sub Grants - \$100,000

- Youth Suicide Prevention Program (\$100,000)

Board of County Commissioners Approval

- Projects over \$500,000
- Subgrants to Nonprofits
- Staff positions that require JEC review.
- Procurement contracts over \$100,000

TIMELINE



Immediate priorities are bringing on staff to provide technical assistance to sub-grantees / community organizations and continuing to work through internal processes for identified projects (i.e. CIP, HR, procurement, and fiscal management).

Reminder: funds must be allocated by December 2024 and expended by December 2026
