NOTICE is hereby given that an Ordinance outlawing the deposits of rubbish and other offensive matter on public or private highways or upon public or private property in the County of Washoe; providing for the appointment of a special officer to enforce this Ordinance; prescribing penalties for violation thereof; and other matters relating thereto, was proposed by Commissioner McKenzie on October 5th, 1959, final action of adoption taken on October 20th, 1959 by the following vote:

ORDINANCE NO. 78

SUMMARY - Provides that the deposits of offense matter on public or private highways or roads or upon public or private property shall be unlawful and prescribes penalties therefor.

AN ORDINANCE OUTLAWING THE DEPOSITS OF RUBBISH AND OTHER OFFENSIVE MATTER ON PUBLIC OR PRIVATE HIGHWAYS OR UPON PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PROPERTY IN THE COUNTY OF WASHOE, PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A SPECIAL OFFICER TO ENFORCE THIS ORDINANCE, PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF, and OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF WASHOE COUNTY DO ORDAIN:

SECTION 1: It shall be unlawful in the County of Washoe:

To place, deposit or dump, or cause to be placed, deposited or dumped, any garbage, swill, cans, bottles, papers, ashes, refuse, carcass of any dead animal, offal, trash, or rubbish, or any noisome, nauseous or offensive matter in, or upon, any public or private highway or road, including any portion of the right-of-way thereof, or in or upon any private property into or upon which the public is admitted by easement or license, or on any private property without the consent of the owner, or in or upon any public park or other public property other than property designated or set aside for such purpose by the governing board or body having charge thereof. Any person, firm or corporation violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

SECTION 2: Appointment of Special Officer:

The County Commissioners shall appoint an officer to enforce the provisions of this ordinance whose duty shall be to make arrests for any violation thereof. Such officer is to be assigned to work with the Health Department. Further, he shall be appointed as a deputy sheriff and shall have the same police

1 powers as any other duly appointed deputy sheriff. The compen-
2 sation for such special officer shall be in an amount fixed by
3 the County Commissioners in a specific sum that the County Com-
4 missioners may from time to time direct.

5 SECTION 3: Penalty:

6 Any person who shall violate the provisions of this ordi-
7 nance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon convic-
8 tion thereof shall be fined in the sum of not more than \$500.00
9 or by imprisonment in the County Jail for a term not to exceed
10 six (6) months, or by both fine and imprisonment.

11 SECTION 4: Effective date:

12 This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and
13 after its passage and approval.
