NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that an ordinance creating a County Park Commission, designating a name for the Commission, establishing the powers of the Commission, and setting forth the facilities for which the Commission shall be responsible, setting forth the names of the six appointed Commissioners who shall serve on the first County Park Commission and stating other matters properly relating thereto was proposed on June 25th, 1963 by Commissioner Sauer as an emergency measure and final action of adoption was taken on June 25th, 1963 by the following vote: Ayes: Commissioners McKenzie, McKissick, Cunningham, Sauer and Streeter. Nays: None. Absent: None. This Ordinance was Numbered 116 and shall be effective from and after July 4th, 1963, the second date of publication. ORDINANCE NO. 116

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A COUNTY PARK COMMISSION, DESIGNATING A NAME FOR THE COMMISSION, ESTABLISHING THE POWERS OF THE COMMISSION, DESIGNATING THE FACILITIES FOR WHICH THE COMMISSION SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE, SETTING FORTH THE NAMES OF THE SIX APPOINTED COMMISSIONERS WHO SHALL SERVE ON THE FIRST COUNTY PARK COMMISSION AND STATING OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO:

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF WASHOE DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. Purpose and authority

Pursuant to the power granted the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County by Chapter 241 of the Statutes of Nevada of 1963, there is hereby created a Washoe County Park Commission.

Section 2. Definitions as used in this Ordinance

- (a) "Board" means the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County.
- (b) "Commission" means the County Park Commission created by this Ordinance.
- (c) "Commissioner" means a member of the County Park Commission created by this Ordinance.
- (d) "Facilities" means any recreational or park property under the jurisdiction and control of the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County.

Section 3. Name of Commission

The County Park Commission created by this Ordinance shall be known as the "Washoe County Park Commission".

Section 4. Powers of the Commission

The powers of the Washoe County Park Commission shall be as follows:

- (a) To implement policy set by Board with regard to recreational and park facilities.
- (b) To promulgate regulations and recommend rates, tolls and charges for services, governing the use or availability of recreational and park facilities to the Board.
- (c) To study, analyze and recommend plans for additional recreational and park facilities and the further development of existing facilities.

(d) To employ technical and clerical staff for the Commission, with the approval of the Board.

(e) To prepare and submit annual budgets to the Board.

(f) To recommend to the Board the purchase or lease of land for recreational and park purposes.

(g) To cooperate with the Washoe County Manager in all matters relating to recreational and park facilities.

(h) To acquire by gift, bequest, or device, any real or personal property for recreational and park facilities, with the approval of the Board.

(i) To recommend contracts for the construction and development of recreational and park facilities.

(j) To conduct land acquisition negotiations subject to the statutes governing purchases and leases of land by the Board and to enter into use agreements with concession operators provided that such agreements be submitted to the Board for their approval. If the Board does not disapprove of such use agreement within thirty (30) days after such agreement has been submitted to them, the agreement shall be deemed approved.

(k) To exercise such additional powers and perform such additional duties as may be delegated by the Board in its discretion for a park and recreation program.

Section 5. Responsibility for facilities

The jurisdiction of the Commission shall consist of responsibility for study, analysis and recommendations for all existing facilities when requested by the Board and the responsibility for the study, analysis and recommendations for all future park and recreational facilities.

Section 6. Financial support

The Board, as a matter of policy, shall reserve, to the extent allowed by law for the use of the Commission all monies collected to the credit of those facilities so designated by the Board.

Section 7. Membership

(a) The Commission shall be composed of nine members, six of whom shall be appointed by the Board from residents of the County at large with reference to their fitness for office.

(b) In addition to the six appointed commissioners, three county commissioners selected by the chairman of the Board shall be members of the Commission and shall serve during their terms of office as county commissioners.

(c) Of the first commissioners appointed, one shall hold office for 1 year, one for 2 years, two for 3 years, and two for 4 years. Thereafter all commissioners shall be appointed for terms of 4 years. The names and terms of office for the first appointed commissioners are as follows:

Tom Cooke	4 year term expiring June 30, 1967
Clifton Young	4 year term expiring June 30, 1967

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Louis Mendive	3 year term expiring June 30, 1966
Jack Walther	3 year term expiring June 30, 1966
Peter Barengo	2 year term expiring June 30, 1965
Dorothy Stafford	1 year term expiring June 30, 1964

(d) Commissioners shall hold office until their successors are elected or appointed as the case may be and qualified.

(e) Any vacancy in the office of commissioner shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as original appointments.

(f) Commissioners shall serve without compensation but shall be entitled to the same travel expenses and subsistence allowances as county officers.

Section 8. Organization and meetings

(a) Within ten (10) days after their appointment, commissioners shall qualify by taking the oath of office. No bond shall be required of them.

(b) Within ten (10) days after their appointment, the commissioners shall organize as the commission by the election of one of their members as chairman, one as secretary, and by the election of such other officers as they may deem necessary.

(c) The commission shall adopt a seal.

(d) The commission shall hold at least four meetings each year and shall keep a complete record of all its transactions.

(e) Any five commissioners shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

(f) Any resolution, motion or other action shall be adopted or ordered taken by a majority of the commissioners forming a quorum.

Section 9. Repealing

(a) All ordinances inconsistent herewith to the extent of such inconsistency, and no further, are hereby repealed.

(b) All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed.

Section 10. Legality

If any provision or part of this ordinance shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal or unconstitutional, it shall in no way affect the remainder of this ordinance or any section thereof, it being intended that the remainder shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 11. Effective date

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication as prescribed by NRS §244.100.
