NOTICE OF COUNTY ORDINANCE
Notice is hereby given that Bill No. 296, amending Ordinance No. 136, entitled "An Ordinance to make it unlawful to discharge firearms on or across County roads, within specified distances of a dwelling in the unincorporated area of the County and within a defined congested area in the unincorporated area of the County; requires reasonable posting by County of congested area in which discharge of firearms prohibited; prescribed penalties for violation thereof and other matters properly relating thereto," was adopted on July 5, 1972 by Commissioners Pagni, Coppa, McKissick, Rusk and Nelson all voting aye.

SUMMARY: Amends Ordinance No. 136 to restrict the discharge of firearms within specified distances of dwellings occupied by others in the unincorporated area of the County, and other matters properly relating thereto.

BILL NO. 296

ORDINANCE NO. 136

AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE IT UNLAWFUL TO DISCHARGE FIREARMS ON OR ACROSS COUNTY ROADS, WITHIN SPECIFIED DISTANCES OF A DWELLING IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF THE COUNTY AND WITHIN A DEFINED CONGESTED AREA IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF THE COUNTY; REQUIRES REASONABLE POSTING BY COUNTY OF CONGESTED AREA IN WHICH DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS PROHIBITED; PRESCRIBED PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF WASHOE DO ORDAIN:

SECTION 1.

Section 2 of Ordinance No. 136 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 2. Discharging of Firearms.

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, shotgun, or other firearm in, on or across any County road or highway.
- B. It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, or other firearm, with the exception of shotguns, air-rifles, or B-B guns, within 5,000 feet of any dwelling occupied by another person or persons within the unincorporated area of the County.
- C. It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge any shotgun, air-rifle, or B-B gun within 1,000 feet of any dwelling occupied by another person or persons within the unincorporated area of the County.
- D. It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, shotgun, or other firearm within any congested area of the County, as defined in Section 3 of this Ordinance.
- E. This Section shall not apply to peace officers nor to persons shooting in any regularly established and lawfully authorized and licensed rifle range, gun club or shooting gallery nor to any person lawfully discharging a firearm in protection of life or property.

SECTION 2.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as prescribed by NRS 244.100.
