An ordinance amending the Washoe County Code at Chapter 5 (Administration and Personnel) by amending certain provisions relating to the maximum payout of accrued sick leave upon an employee's death, separation, disability or termination from employment, and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

#### WHEREAS:

- A. The Washoe County Board of County Commissioners desires to amend the Washoe County Code at Chapter 5 by increasing the maximum payout of accrued sick leave upon an employee's death, separation, disability or termination from employment from 600 to 800 hours, and providing for other matters properly related thereto;
- B. Business Impact Statement: No business impact.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF WASHOE COUNTY DOES HEREBY ORDAIN:

- SECTION 1. Section 5.255 of the Washoe County Code is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 5.255 Sick leave accrual and payment on death, separation, disability or termination.
- 1. An employee separated from service earns sick leave only through the last working day for which he is entitled to pay. If that last working day is prior to the last day of the pay period, the amount of sick leave accrued during that pay period shall be prorated.

- 2. Upon death, retirement or permanent disability of an employee, or upon termination of an employee after 10 years of full-time employment (or its equivalent if the employee has not served as a full-time employee) for other than just cause, an employee shall be compensated for total accrued sick leave in excess of 300 hours at the rate of 1 hour's pay at the employee's regular hourly rate for every 2 hours of such excess. The maximum payment for accrued sick leave shall not exceed 800 hours at the employee's regular hourly rate. No payment shall be made for accrued sick leave of 300 hours or less.
- 3. Upon recommendation of the county manager, the board of county commissioners may, in its sole discretion, increase the amount of sick leave payoff described in subsection 2 to any individual employee who has been employed for any length of time by altering the formula used to calculate the sick leave payoff provided for in subsection 2, or the minimum or maximum payoff provided for in subsection 2.
- 4. An employee who is laid off and is subsequently rehired pursuant to section 5.311 shall, on the date he returns to work, be restored with all uncompensated sick leave which had accrued on the date of the layoff.

#### SECTION 2. General Terms.

- 1. All actions, proceedings, matters and things heretofore taken, had and done by the County and its officers not inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are ratified and approved.
- 2. The Chairman of the Board and the officers of the County are authorized and directed to take all action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this ordinance. The District Attorney is authorized to make non-substantive edits and corrections to this Ordinance.
- 3. All ordinances, resolutions, bylaws and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency. This repealer shall not be construed to revive any ordinance, resolution, bylaw or order, or part thereof, heretofore repealed.
- 4. Each term and provision of this ordinance shall be valid and shall be enforced to the extent permitted by law. If any term or provision of this ordinance or the application thereof shall be deemed by a court of competent jurisdiction to be in violation of law or public policy,

then it shall be deemed modified, ipso facto, to bring it within the limits of validity or enforceability, but if it cannot be so modified, then it shall be excised from this ordinance. In any event, the remainder of this ordinance, or the application of such term or provision to circumstances other than those to which it is invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected.
