Title: **Commission Regulation 17-02, Noncommercial Collection of Reptiles and Amphibians for 2017-2018, Amendment #1 – For Possible Action/Public Comment Allowed**

Description: The Commission will consider and may take action to change Commission Regulation 17-02, Amendment #1, for the 2017-2018 season and limits for noncommercial hobby collecting of live, unprotected reptiles and amphibians.

Summary:

The Commission may consider making changes to Commission Regulation 17-02 in an amendment (#1) and adopting the subsequent changes for the remainder of the 2017-2018 season and limits for noncommercial hobby collecting of live, unprotected reptiles and amphibians. Currently, the field collection season is from January 1 – December 31. The species in the attached list are currently allowed to be collected with bag and possession limits. Reptile species not specifically listed within the attached table are closed to noncommercial collection.
