



Overall Process Timeline







What changes have you noticed?


Respondents were asked to describe the way Washoe has changed over time... Decreased Public Services Deteriorating Parks Reduced Safety Losing Open Space Increase Urban Sprawlincreased Home Construction IC eased Unaffordable Housing Economic Growth Strained Resources Disappearing Rura

What do you love about Washoe County?

- Participants overwhelmingly value Washoe's access to recreation and natural areas.
- The small-town feel of Washoe County and rural heritage are key aspects to respondents.
- In the "Other" category, participants affirmed their appreciation for Washoe's natural environment and rich cultural history.



What needs to be improved?





- Over half of participants believe that transportation needs to be improved.
- Major themes include managed growth and affordable housing.
- "Other" responses emphasize
 community safety and education.

All communities chose

Top Topics to be included in Area Plan Goals & Policies

Every community mentioned **at least one** of the following additional priorities:

- Water quality, water resource management, or wildlife corridor protection
- Affordable housing
- Traffic and road infrastructure
- Access and maintenance of public trails

- iv. Strengthen access to transportation, including better concurrency of transportation infrastructure with development.




