Regional Street Naming Committee:

Four applications for naming or renaming of existing streets, easements, or alleyways have been submitted for consideration. The applications are as followed:

New Business

1) [Raven Wing](#)

An application to name an unnamed easement to **Raven Wing** was received on November 11, 2021. The easement is located within unincorporated Washoe County west of Red Rock Road in an area referred to as Red Rock Estates. The Applicant is requesting to name the easement due to a change in access to their property. Previous access was via Bobcat Hill Road and is no longer available. Additional concerns about mail and package delivery have been expressed due to the change in access to the property. Five parcels were noticed. Two parcels (both owned by the Applicant) would be affected by the proposed request.

Washoe County GIS performed due diligence by checking the proposed street names against the Master Street Directory for any existing, duplicate, or similar-sounding street names for the purpose of emergency management. The proposed street name is unique and has been accepted into the Street Reservation List.

2) [Fasani Avenue](#)

An application to rename Litch Court to **Fasani Avenue** was received on December 2, 2021. Litch Court is within the City of Reno's jurisdiction, runs in a north-south direction and lies between Mary's Street to the north and an unnamed alleyway to the south. The Applicant requested to rename Litch Court to recognize Arthur Fasani and Fasani Painting. The Applicant stated Fasani Painting is the oldest painting contractor in the area and has been family owned and operated since 1912. Arthur Fasani moved to 220 Mary Street in 1906 where the property is still family owned. Eleven parcels were noticed. Seven parcels, with an estimated seventeen addresses would be affected by the proposed request.



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Washoe County GIS performed due diligence by checking the proposed street names against the Master Street Directory for any existing, duplicate, or similar-sounding street names for the purpose of emergency management. The proposed street name is unique and has been accepted into the Street Reservation List.

3) **Self Storage Way**

An application to name an unnamed easement to **Self Storage Way** was received on October 25, 2021. The easement is located within the City of Spark's jurisdiction on the east side of Vista Boulevard. The easement was created through recorded document #5256472 as shown on Record of Survey 6316(a). Currently, the easement services 2 parcels; however, the Applicant stated a parcel map is currently submitted and under review where the easement will serve 4 parcels, if approved. No addresses are anticipated to be affected if approved.

Washoe County GIS performed due diligence by checking the proposed street names against the Master Street Directory for any existing, duplicate, or similar-sounding street names for the purpose of emergency management. The proposed street name is unique and has been accepted into the Street Reservation List.

4) **Golden Triangle Way**

An application to name an unnamed easement to **Golden Triangle Way** was received on December 28, 2021. The easement is located within the City of Spark's jurisdiction on the east side of Vista Boulevard. The easement was created through recorded document #5256472 as shown on Record of Survey 6316(a). Currently, the easement services 2 parcels, however; the Applicant stated a parcel map is currently submitted and under review where the easements will serve 3 parcels, if approved. There are also 378 addresses associated with a planned apartment complex that would be affected by the proposed request. The apartment complex is yet to start construction.

Washoe County GIS performed due diligence by checking the proposed street names against the Master Street Directory for any existing, duplicate, or similar-sounding street names for the purpose of emergency management. The proposed street name is unique and has been accepted into the Street Reservation List.



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
