



Position Title: <u>Defensible Space Program Intern</u>

Duration: June 8th, 2025 - 15 weeks or 600 hours

Pay: \$20.00

Objective: The intern will partner with County and community partners to create a replicable defensible space program. The program will need to have one pilot area completed using the program and have a tool for replication in future areas throughout the county.

Deliverables

- Schedule meetings as needed to ensure communication flow
- Create metrics to show time and money needed for implementation in other areas of the county
- Help change Community Fencing and Landscape Regulations using agency relationships already in place
- Help community move towards becoming a Firewise Community
- Have program piloted on one area and have created a replication tool
- Presentation of pilot program and replication tool to local groups such as Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPC)

Timeline

The internship is expected to last 15 weeks (just under 4 months), with the following milestones:

- 1. Weeks 1-3: Begin discussion with partners and consideration of geographic area.
- 2. Weeks 4-6: Select area and dates and begin communications with all partners.
- 3. Weeks 7-8: Continue communications, set up ongoing maintenance inspection schedule.
- 4. Week 9-11: Complete property assessments, fuels removal, Home Fire Campaign, and revegetation while tracking details of the process.
- 5. Weel 12–13: Compile documentation and tracked information, create metrics submit summary report to WCEM. Also submit a program replication tool.



6. Weeks 14-15: Final review and evaluation of pilot area and the program replication tool. Presentation to LEPC, or other local groups.

Qualifications:

- Current enrollment in a relevant undergraduate or graduate program (e.g., Emergency Management, Public Administration, Social Sciences).
- Strong project management skills which include planning, organizing and management resources to accomplish the goal within the timeframe agreed upon
- Persistence and creativity obstacles will arise and must be overcome with creative solutions
- Attention to detail many components that will need to be planned, executed and tracked
- Interest in mitigation with general understanding of the concept, intention, and application of mitigation actions

Benefits:

- Hands-on experience in developing and implementing a replicable mitigation action program.
- Opportunity to network with professionals in emergency management and community resilience.
- Exposure to real-world challenges and the chance to make a meaningful impact on community safety and preparedness.

Supervision: The intern will report to Sabrina Brasuell, who will provide guidance and support throughout the internship period.

Adjustments can be made based on specific organizational needs and the intern's background. This scope of work provides a structured framework for the intern to contribute effectively to the development of a successful mass care program.
