

Northern Nevada Coordinated Entry

Coordinated Entry is a local process that helps people who do not have a place to live find housing. It connects individuals and families experiencing homelessness with housing funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). When someone needs help finding a home, they can take an assessment called the Community Housing Assessment Tool (CHAT). Their CHAT score reflects a person's housing needs. People with higher scores get priority on the list for available housing.



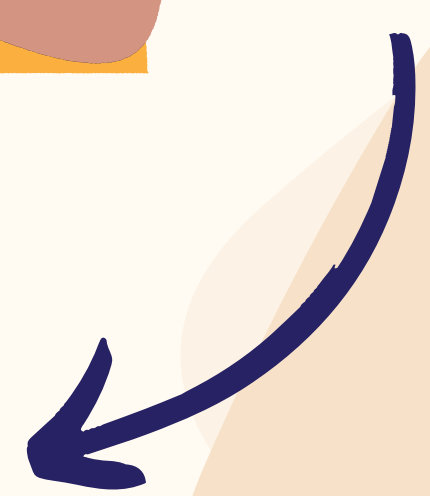
1. Meet with an outreach or case worker



2. Answer questions to identify housing needs



3. Added to prioritized list for housing, if eligible



4. Referred to local public housing based on prioritization, eligibility, and available openings
