We will meet you where you are at

There are many stories that can be shared of a person attaining permanent housing but there are some stories of less permanence that may mean as much but are often overlooked. Such is the story of a young person and their parent who were sleeping in their car and occasional motel rooms. After being in the cycle of homelessness for an extended amount of time and with the parent's health rapidly declining, each person made a likely difficult and humbling decision to reach out for help through Washoe County Housing and Homeless Services.

They were connected to the Homeless Outreach Proactive Engagement Team (H.O.P.E.) Outreach team but were initially uncertain and resistant to the degree of commitment change involved. With the assistance, encouragement, and rapport built between the HOPE team case managers and the Participants, the parent enrolled in the Nevada Cares Campus Emergency Shelter and the young adult applied for and was voted into the Nevada Cares Campus Safe Camp.

What makes this such a successful story, in the works, is it has allowed the parent and the young adult to break free of the overwhelming worry for one another as well as any codependency that had them both experiencing homelessness. With encouragement, advocacy, and a leap of faith, the young adult agreed to go into Safe Camp to work on reviving their dreams which allowed the parent, with the assistance of their Campus case manager, the emotional freedom to pursue and attain appropriate treatment and placement in a skilled nursing facility. This would not have been a likely conclusion for either person had they failed to take some risks, denied the need for change, and/or refused to trust others. Let's look forward to their continued success.
