

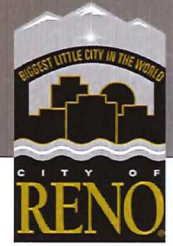

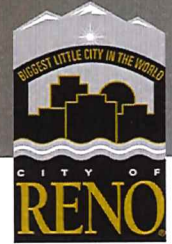


FY 2018-2019 Federal Funding



- Northern Nevada CoC Funding for FY 2018 -2019 (\$1,614,116)
 - VOA/ReStart - ANCHOR Permanent Supportive Housing \$796,803
 - Washoe County - Permanent Supportive Housing \$86,328
 - Washoe County - Shelter Plus Care \$119,616
 - Clark County SS - HMIS Northern Nevada \$122,822
 - VOA/ReStart - Rapid Rehousing for Families \$87,659
 - Safe Embrace - Rapid Rehousing for Domestic Violence Survivors \$195,076
 - NNAMHS - Shelter Plus Care \$175,812
 - City of Reno - Coordinated Entry Management \$30,000
- HUD Funding for CAC Operations FY 2019-2020
 - City of Reno - \$770,885
 - City of Sparks - \$109,350

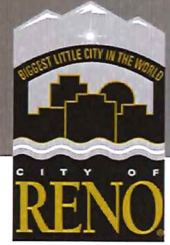
HUD CoC Housing Programs



- **Permanent Supportive Housing / Shelter Plus Care**
 - This program is designed to house and support those most vulnerable in the community, and allows for financial housing support and wrap around case management for a person's lifetime.

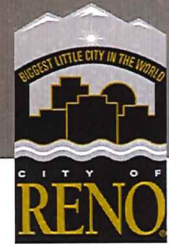
- **Rapid Rehousing**
 - This program is designed for those that may need temporary housing supports to end homelessness, and allows for housing supports and wrap around case management for up to 24 months.

Federal Guidelines for CoC



- Data entry into the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS)
- Meet data management standards around timeliness and completeness
- Housing First Model
- Coordinated Entry (CE), a community wide housing referral system based on a prioritized wait list

Federal Low Barrier Best Practices



- No background checks
- No cost to enter
- No program participation requirements
- Shelter rules focus on safety
- Sobriety is not a requirement
- No alcohol and drug consumption on shelter premises
