## EH's engagement services include:

- Warm meals for breakfast, and dinner
- Hygiene supplies such as showers, laundry, clothing, and lockers
- Afternoon drop-in services with activities such as tutoring, yoga, art, cooking, and classes
- Case managers who work with young people to reduce barriers and set goals for long-term housing and stability
- Onsite clinic
- Onsite mental health and chemical dependency counseling



Young people with less than a high school diploma or GED have a 346% higher risk of experiencing homelessness. Education disrupts the cycle of homelessness and enables young people to discover their interests and pursue their passions. EH's education programs focus on helping homeless youth overcome barriers to educational achievement. Many young people are experiencing school success for the first time. They are welcomed to a classroom that encourages diverse learning styles and helps build confidence for every student.



## Employment

One of the most common questions young people ask when they arrive at Eddy House is: can you help me find a job? Safe housing is an essential first step to gaining stability, but education and employment are essential to maintaining that stability over time. EH's apprentice employment programs will offer young people transformative ways to build the skills and confidence to explore a career and gain long-term employment. This includes a range of options from job-readiness to internships and employment in the local economy.
