### Highlights

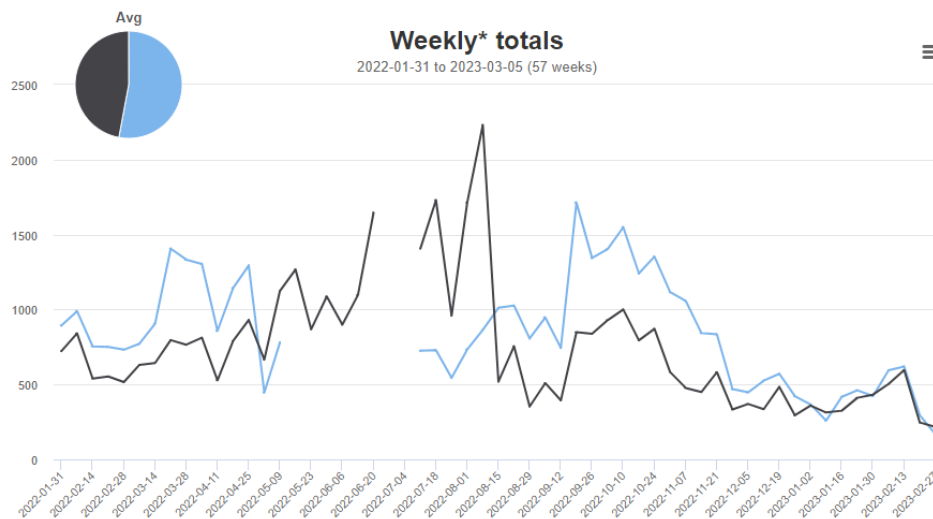
- ◆ Application of insecticide on selected trees to prevent borer damage.
