I want to thank the WC Parks Commissioners for NOT YET forwarding the vague proposal of a soccer stadium at their May meeting. I live near that area, deal with Wedge traffic issues, and watched the meeting video. It's not a bad idea, but its location interferes with planned park facilities - and produces a traffic nightmare. With those obvious drawbacks, I was shocked that FOFR didn't have even a sketch of their proposed stadium/garage on the space, nor where 2 of the once-planned 4 WLL fields might be (re)located. Also unconsidered were traffic access points for the vehicles of 5500 fans. FOFR's presentation provided NO substance that would assure users about the removal of planned park facilities or consider roads/entrances/parking that are already overwhelmed on game days. The entire package seemed oversold by Wendy Damonte . . . "We are <u>locals</u>, and it will turn out fine. I am on a timeline for 2026 World Cup soccer" - even though there is no plan! FOFR did entertain the possibility of an additional South Virginia entrance/exit for the soccer stadium. That should be a MANDATORY requirement, as Wedge/Arrowcreek Parkways simply cannot manage another 3000 soccer vehicles. There are currently about 200 vehicles that struggle to find Little League parking space and to enter/exit on Wedge/Arrowcreek Parkways. Simultaneous soccer traffic from existing fields creates congestion that overflows into neighborhoods west of Wedge. RenoIce adds to the mix, and left turns to enter/exit all 3 forums are a mess. FOFR's added traffic on Wedge would be impossible! Proposed S Virginia egress from the soccer stadium would also be very congested due to the limited road capacity for soccer fans returning north to Reno after a game. The only egress onto Virginia is southbound, to the signaled intersection at Mt Rose Hwy/Geiger Grade. Those same fans would then need to make a U-turn to head north on Virginia, then merge onto I-580 northbound. Imagine 3000 cars in a single U-turn lane that is only 4000' from the stadium to the signal! Who pays the needed road construction costs?

I have read the staff report regarding the proposed ground lease of S. Valleys regional parkland for a soccer stadium. I am greatly concerned regarding the unsolicited development proposal for several reasons:

1. The public parkland would ultimately be under control to a for-profit entity, under the umbrella of the non-profit leasee and for-profit corporations or LLC are not driven to serve the public's interest; their interest is to make

profit and this is not an appropriate use of public parklands.

- 2. The proposed soccer complex does not fully meet the original park master plan site. A thorough review and public process to modify the master plan should be undertaken to determine potential other public park and recreation facilities should be developed on the site, such as a much needed public aquatic center; similar to the one being constructed at Moana Springs Aquatic Center.
- 3. The proposal that is before the Commission, although has a detailed conceptual site Master Plan, it does not include a financial Business Plan or feasibility study. Without this additional information, how can the Commission make a qualified decision that this partnership between the newly formed non-profit FOFF and this proposed private for-profit corporation/LLC is financially well capitalized and managed to undertake such a monumental venture of \$40,000,000?

My understanding is that Item 8, a proposal by Wendy Damonte for FOFF, will be discussed at today's Washoe County Open Space and Regional Parks Committee meeting. I hope any corporate or commercial proposal that will encroach on public park land in the area near Wedge and Mt. Rose Hwy. will be dismissed out of hand. Access to the library and athletic fields in the area should remain the priority. Neither area roads nor other infrastructure will support a stadium, and why deprive local residents, young people engaged in sports, dog owners, and library patrons easy access to the best facilities in south Reno in order to support a private venture? Public parks should serve residents and visitors to the region. And, in this case, there are no comparable facilities nearby that could accommodate current users.
