Highlights

- ◆ June featured an in-house art gallery exhibit showcasing art of and made by Wilbur D. May
- July featured a mixed media art gallery exhibit by Latimer Art Club: "Celebrate Summer"
- June and July, Discovery Room and museum volunteers alongside Rancho Rangers offered free days with themed arts and crafts seeing 50+ attendees per day
- ◆ Park trees in front of the museum were "yarn bombed" by local knit enthusiasts who left the trees decorated with a circus theme all of July

May Arboretum Report June 2024 – July 2024

Highlights

- ◆ 4,874 people came through the arboretum. Mainly for Spring photos with blossoms and flowers
- ♦ May Arboretum Society held a Summer solstice celebration event.
- ♦ 8 weddings occurred in the Gardens
- New pavers laid in the Labyrinth Garden

May Arboretum Environmental Educational Programs

- Summer education classes of Nature Journaling and Nature Lesson
- ◆ 5 private tours given (HOA's, schools, nonprofit organizations, etc.)
- ◆ Little sprouts (kids 2-4) being hosted in the Ranch House (approx. 20 kids weekly)
- Olli education programs for gardening and bird watching are held every third Wednesday (about 20 people per class)
- Washoe County Library story time in the Arboretum in Honey's Garden every Thursday. About 65 participants every week.

Arboretum Operations

- Irrigation repairs:
 - o 3 mainline repairs
 - 200 feet of dripline repair
 - 47 sprinkler heads adjusted and cleaned
- Mulch was spread throughout the Arboretum
- All 4,000 annuals have been planted in the gardens. Planted by staff and volunteers
- ♦ Greenhouse is being cleaned
- Cactus and succulents are being propagated for garden expansion
- ♦ 3 trees have been planted
