# **Arboretum Operations**

- 65 yards of donated mulch from local arborists was spread throughout the Arboretum

- ◆ Approx. 1,000 seeds planted in the greenhouse for this season
- Find an electrician to install a new controller in the Greenhouse
- Removal of dead trees and branches to ensure safety in Arboretum and Great Basin Adventure
- ♦ John Crandell Tree Service
- ◆ 10 Trees and 10 shrubs were donated to the Arboretum from the May Arboretum Society to be planted in the park.
