Northern Nevada Counter Terrorism Center



- Originally founded as one of two state of Nevada, Fusion Centers.
- Partnered with Reno/Sparks/State of Nevada
- Disbanded and re-formed into NNRIC when state moved the fusion center to Carson City, NV.

- Following the move of the FUSION center to Carson City, the three remaining agencies in the area saw a need for an intelligence center based in Washoe County.
- NNRIC was formed with members of Reno PD, Sparks PD, and the WCSO assigned as crime analysts, intelligence analysts, and detectives.

NNRIC currently utilizes assigned Detectives for multiple functions

- Threat assessment
- Undercover operations
- Informant Cultivation
- Social Media Mining

Detention Analyst

NNRIC currently has one Deputy assigned from the Washoe County Detention Facility that acts as an analyst. This Deputy is responsible for conducting interviews of incarcerated individuals for intelligence purposes and acts as a liaison between in custody operations and out of custody enforcement.



Camera Systems


Real time Platform

- Incorporates data points from digital sources throughout region.
- Video, traffic patterns, License plate
 readers, social media, news, and police data
 all visible on a "Single pane" platform so
 that operators can get a "Real Time"
 assessment of incidents



Participation

- Washoe County Sheriffs Office has purchased approximately 120 cameras for deployment in region.
- Deployment was coordinated using crime analysis of areas that experience highest crime through year and major thoroughfares.

Real Time Crime Center Partnership



Take Away:

- \$0 cost to parks budget
- Temporary cameras have been used successfully in Parks for 3 years
 - E.g. Hidden Valley
 - Result was an immediate decrease in crimes in parks
- Focus will be on parking lots
- Cameras are pointed away from residences
- A reasonable expectation of privacy will be maintained
 - Bathrooms, pools, splash pads
