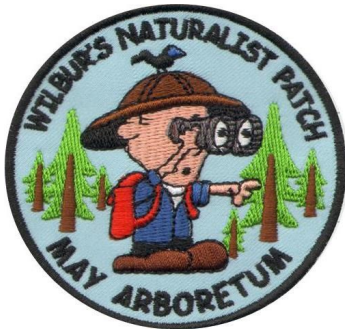

Leaf, Scale, and Pine Needle Rubbings

1. Find a leaf you think is interesting.
2. Set your leaf on a hard surface.
3. Place the white sheet of paper on top.
4. Use the side of your pencil to color over the leaf.
5. Record your Nature Notes.
6. Repeat steps 1-5 for pine needles and scales too!

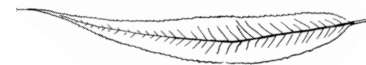
