Elder Gap Services Report

Center for Healthy Aging City of Reno Senior Citizens Advisory Committee Interim Report - April 6, 2016

The Center for Healthy Aging (CHA) through funds from the City of Reno Senior Citizen Advisory Committee collaborated with Washoe County Senior Services to date to provide four Reno elders a variety of short term services that helped these targeted poor, at-risk frail elders to remain in good health and in the community. Services included home repair, mattresses/covers, and assistance with unpaid utilities.

All of these poor, chronically ill, frail elders were extremely grateful to the City of Reno, the Reno Senior Citizen Advisory Committee for enabling them to fill a gap in service that improved their quality of life and maintain their health in the community (refer to the attached service descriptions).

City of Reno Senior Citizens Advisory Committee Elder Gap Funding

<u>Carolyn C.:</u> Carolyn is a 62 year old disabled woman. The client needed a new water tank for her well. The Elder Gap Funds recipient had been displaced because she had no water. The new water tank allowed her to move back into her home. The help with this purchase is very much appreciated!

<u>Harry K.:</u> Harry is a 66 year old disabled man. Harry has no support system. He moved into an unfurnished apartment and did not have the funds to purchase a bed. Harry lives on a very low income from social security disability. He would be sleeping on the floor if it wasn't for the generosity of the City of Reno Senior Citizens Advisory Committee Elder Gap Funds. Harry is grateful for the purchase of his bed!

<u>Walter G.:</u> Walter is an 87 year old man. Walter has minor cognitive challenges and, although he has good intentions, he has not been the best steward with his money. Walter was 2 months behind on his power bill from NV Energy. Walter's power was in jeopardy of being shut off. Elder Gap Funds were used to pay Walter's late utility bill. Walter has since agreed to have Washoe County Senior Services become his representative payee. Walter is happy for the funds that allowed him to maintain his electricity!

<u>Brenda H.:</u> Brenda is a 67 year old disabled woman. Brenda has been sleeping on a hospital bed that has a worn out and soiled mattress. The old soggy mattress made it difficult for Brenda to get out of her bed to transfer to the commode. The new firm mattress and mattress cover has greatly improved Brenda's ability to transfer and she sleeps in more sanitary conditions.
