Information current through July 13th



### From January 1st – March 13th:

67,878 meals delivered to 1,148 individual clients

## From March 16th – July 13th:

- ▶ 125,737 meals delivered to 1,521 clients
  - This is a 24.5% increase in clientele over January March time period



#### On March 23rd:

- Aging and Disability Services Division (ADSD) approves relaxed nutritional standards to meet the COVID-19 response.
- >ADSD no longer required signatures for meals
- ➤ Emergency Meal Service starts
  - ➤ 13,211 emergency/temporary meals have been provided



### <u>Partnerships</u>

## Reno Sparks Indian Colony (RSIC)

➤ 1,425 meals provided to 95 seniors due to positive COVID-19 test results and community isolation

### Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe

➤ 1,750 meals provided to 70 seniors due to lack of programming for community isolation

#### Of Interest:

- ➤ 13 additional delivery routes created for emergency/temporary meal delivery
- Washoe County Staff and volunteers provided grocery and other household supply deliveries
- Only 4 of 25 volunteer HDM drivers decide to take hiatus due to COVID-19 concerns
- All volunteer packers remain to support ongoing HDM efforts during COVID-19
- Major plumbing repair/overhaul in kitchen with no service interruption!



# On March 17th in room dining ceased and only To-Go meals are offered

## January 1 – March 13

> 28,232 meals provided

## March 16 – July 13

- 20,274 meals provided as a to-go meal
- Client count is down approximately 50% of pre-COVID-19 numbers



#### Site Meal Service since March 16th

- >Reno: Providing
- ➤ Sparks: Providing
- ➤Sun Valley: Providing
- ➤ Spanish Springs/Lazy 5: Providing
- >Cold Springs: not providing, due to lack of client participation



#### Gerlach

- Number of meal provided doubled to Washoe County School District (WCSD).
  - > Parents provided daily meals, as needed.
  - > Average: 9-18 individuals, daily.



#### Of Interest

- Reno location interior repainted in Washoe County color scheme for consistency with Washoe County
- Major kitchen repair completed with no disruption to meal service

### Case Management:

- Caseworkers maintained regular communication with their clients
- Caseworkers have resumed limited in person contact and are adding clients to their caseloads (as of July 1st)

#### **Homemaker Services:**

> No disruption in services unless requested by the client

#### Rep Payee:

No disruption in services

## Daybreak Changes

- Daybreak Doors closed March 17th
- > Regular contact with caregivers and clients
- In July, virtual outreach such as Zoom activities started
- As of August 3rd there is a daily Zoom activity
- Activity packets have been delivered to caregivers and their loved ones
