Prior to her corporate and consulting work, Mary Ann was a journalist for an Iowa daily newspaper and owned and operated a community newspaper in Southeastern Kansas.

In 2013 she was named an IABC Fellow, the highest honor bestowed on IABC members. She holds a bachelor of journalism degree from the University of Missouri School of Journalism.
