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
4. APPROVAL OF OCTOBER 17, 2024, AND JANUARY 23, 2025, MINUTES [For Possible Action]

 Committee members may identify any additions or corrections to the draft minutes as transcribed.


Ed Atwell, UNR, moved to approve the minutes as written. Jenn Felter, Washoe County, provided the second. There was no response to the call for Committee or public comment. Upon a call for the vote, the motion carried unanimously.

5. **NEVADA SHARED RADIO SYSTEM PROJECT UPDATE** [Non-Action Item] – A presentation and discussion on the progress of the Nevada Share Radio System (NSRS) project status, cutover outlook, and possible prioritization for NSRS Regions and site builds. *Melissa Lawney & Adrian Armold NSRS System Administrator*

Melissa Lawney, Washoe County Technology Services, reviewed the <u>presentation</u> for this item reviewing the plans for Marble Bluff, Poito and Seven Lakes progress. There has been consideration of microregion planning in order to continue progress. The schedule has not been updated. If work is not accomplished in the summer of 2025, the date for cutover will be moved out several years. A complete change order has not been agreed to.



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MicroRegions- Affect on Washoe County



- Plan is to complete P25 Line and Antenna installation in Ely, Nevada, working up to Elko, Nevada. Then following the I-80 Corridor and go East to West.
- There is <u>not</u> a plan to bring up Reno this year, Due to unbuilt sites within our region. (Smokey Quartz, Seven Lakes, Biltmore)*
- However, the plan continues to install sites from Carson down to Hawthorne. To connect to existing Region 1 coverage
- The hope is to complete installations in the region around Pyramid Lake, possibly up to Gerlach.
 - · WCRCS sites to complete would include:
 - Marble Bluff
 - Virginia Peak
 - · Other NSRS sites: Painted Rock
 - Eagle Ridge
 - Toulon
 USA PKWY
- MicroRegions are still under discussion, and not fully vetted. We await a schedule and discussions with L3Harris.
- First request for change order REJECTED, Awaiting new draft from L3Harris Request For Change (RFC)



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Adrian Armold, NSRS System Administrator, spoke to the contemplations of schedule changes with microregions based on site readiness and coordination with members; negotiations remain ongoing with a focus on implementation and installation and commissioning within Regions Two and Three 2025. He offered to act as a liaison for agencies with L3 Harris.

There was discussion of the potential to have Micro Regions though nothing has been agreed upon. It is uncertain how work would be prioritized should the Micro Regions be adopted. Ongoing conversations are underway with L3 Harris for an updated schedule. It was emphasized that the priorities be set to accomplish all work that is obtainable as soon as is practical. Concerns were expressed that quoted prices have changed over time and how to best resolve discrepancies.

There was discussion of the BLM permitting process and the potential to provide additional Committee input/correspondence to the BLM to support the needs of the Communication System. Parts for the 800 MHz system are available and in partnership with the State of Nevada there is an ongoing process to procure parts to ensure the success of the project.

In response to questions about the Micro Regions, most sites are outside Washoe County's region; the goal is to prioritize work and sites that are available. Red Peak would likely be active in 2026. As soon as the BLM permits are issued, construction on those sites will commence. There is contingency money provided for in the P25 Addendum language. There was discussion about the delays with the BLM permitting process, the timeline, and the efforts the Committee members could take to assist with accelerating the process. Additional funds were paid by Nevada Department of Transportation to accelerate the process seemingly to no avail.

It was clarified a letter from the Committee or a sub-committee would require proper Open Meeting Law notification; Vice-Chair and Member Ketring agreed to work together to draft a letter from the Committee to the BLM. There are considerations for operational activities concerning how regions are being divided and the impacts to users. Additionally, if the Ash Fields is not completed, it will not impact P25 cutover. It was requested that P25 TAC Committee consider review of LIDs, antennae and equipment.

 - Request to have an L3Harris representative attend a future meeting to address questions with orders.
