6. FISCAL YEAR 2025-2026 WCRCS (WASHOE COUNTY REGIONAL COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM) BUDGET [For Possible Action] – Review, discussion, and possible action to approve one of three Washoe County Regional Communication System (WCRCS) Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Budget scenarios and recommend that the Washoe County Board of County Commissioners approve the recommended budget scenario. *Quinn Korbulic, Washoe County Technology Services.*

Quinn Korbulic, Washoe County Technology Services, reviewed the <u>staff report</u> and <u>recommended FY26 budget</u> (Budget Worksheet Two, Scenario Two) for this item. The proposed budget is approximately a 2.8 percent increase, primarily due to salary and benefits, utility, overhead and lease increases. It was recommended to continue with a ten percent contribution to the Infrastructure Fund. There are equipment needs to be prepared for the new system. There were three scenarios provided for consideration. There was discussion of the P25 impacts to the Infrastructure Fund and five-year system maintenance plan.

Ed Atwell, UNR, moved to recommend FY26 Budget Scenario Two, with a ten percent contribution to infrastructure. Charlie Moore, Truckee Meadows Fire Protection District, provided the second. There was no further Committee discussion or response to the call for public comment. Upon a call for a vote, the motion carried unanimously. Chair Moore made himself available to present to the Board of County Commissioners if needed.

7. VETERANS AFFAIRS POLICE DEPARTMENT SPONSORSHIP OF VETERANS AFFAIRS MEDICAL TO JOIN THE WCRCS AS A SPONSORED AGENCY [For Possible Action] – A review, discussion, and possible action to approve the inclusion of Veteran's Affairs Emergency Medical as a Sponsored Agency, sponsored by VA Police. *Melissa Lawney, Washoe County Technology Services.*

Bryan Boren, Department of Veterans Affairs, shared the aim of the request is to bring on additional communication with Emergency Management, emergency room & ambulance service that is going to be started 2025; and be able to communicate with other area hospitals for disasters and emergency response. There is a similar model in place in Churchill County. This would also allow for coordination with hospitals in the larger service area.

There was discussion questioning the need for a formal agreement with Emergency Management separate from the Police agreement already in place. It was recommended that Mr. Korbulic and Mr. Boren work together to determine what would work best and be in alignment with the Interlocal provisions. It was further requested that an item be brought back to the Committee with a presentation/update on progress and the item could be revisited if necessary.
