4. APPROVAL OF THE APRIL 17, 2025, AND JULY 24, 2025, MINUTES

Derek Keller, City of Sparks, moved to approve the minutes of April 17, 2025, and July 24, 2025, as written. Chris Ketring, Truckee Meadows Fire Protection District, provided the second. There was no response to the call for Committee or public comment. Upon a call for the vote, the motion carried on a 10-0 vote.

5. SYSTEM STATUS

Quinn Korbolic, Washoe County Technology Services, introduced Regional Communications Coordinator Tyler Gerber-Winn, who conducted a slideshow presentation and reviewed slides with the following titles: WCRCS Staff Update; System Status Update (3 slides); and Alpha Paging Decommission.

Mr. Korbolic noted that Shawn Taylor has prior experience as a regional communications coordinator, and that, combined with his technical experience, makes him a great resource. Staff is also working with another contractor to help with bi-directional amplifier inspections. These resources will be invaluable as staffing to full capacity gets underway. Mr. Gerber-Winn clarified that full staffing on the infrastructure side of things would consist of his position and four network engineers, but currently only his position and one network engineer position are filled. It was noted that the radio side of the department is fully staffed.

Mr. Gerber-Winn provided a brief background for Tom Brinkoetter, the contractor responsible for helping clean up the RF noise floor in the urban core. He explained that due to the government shutdown, the Bureau of Land Management has an undetermined level of responsiveness, but because of recent federal changes, all communication sites get categorical exemptions, lessening the permitting requirements. He said staff was in the process of securing right-of-way agreements with landowners to get power poles up to Smokey Quartz.

Mr. Korbolic indicated the alpha numeric paging system is expected to be decommissioned at the end of the calendar year. The one team that currently uses it has been made aware that it will be decommissioned. The choice to get rid of the system was because Washoe County pays for the it, which comes with a pretty substantial cost, yet the only agency that uses it is not part of the County. Mr. Gerber-Winn noted that staff has held pre-planning meetings with the Truckee Meadows Fire Protection District and the Cities of Reno and Sparks about streamlining how radios for the fire agencies are programmed and looking for additional operational efficiencies.

Chair Ryan Sommers, North Lake Tahoe Fire Protection District, asked whether school light zones were activated via pagers. A brief discussion ensued regarding the operation of those light zones. It was stated that the system is controlled through the Regional Transportation Commission, and the relevant contact information would be found and relayed to the Committee.
