IMPROVEMENTS IN RADIO CAPABILITIES AND REDUCTION IN THE NUMBER OF PERSONALITIES

- Reducing talk group duplication across larger 64 channel blocks will allow faster channel access in changing situations.
- Blocks can be mission specific
- Reduction of the number of personalities, currently over 800
- Goal: to reduce portable and mobile personalities per agency
- Group Access to be controlled through per channel encryption key management using Over The Air Re-Keying (OTAR)



TACTICAL ENCRYPTION CHANNELS

- New interoperable encrypted tactical channels available now for special incidents
 - PS ETACI and PS ETAC2 deployed and available for special operations groups to coordinate
 - PS ETAC3 and PS ETAC4 to be released soon
- Expanded use of encryption
 - All new public safety radios required to have AES encryption, P25 Phase 2 capability and OTAR (highly recommended for non-public safety)
