SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR CORRECTED REIMBURSEMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$.19 DUE TO A CLERICAL ERROR FOR THE CITY OF RENO FOR PUBLIC SAFETY SERVER MAINTENANCE AND SUBSCRIPTION LICENSING APPROVED JANUARY 15, 2026 BY THE 911 EMERGENCY RESPONSE ADVISORY COMMITTEE AND APRIL 14, 2026 BY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS [For Possible Action] -

A review, discussion and possible action to approve, deny or otherwise modify a request to reimburse the correct costs associated with the purchase of extended server maintenance and VMware licensing subscriptions required to host and support the Tiburon CAD system and database, for a total amount not to exceed \$45,226.19 (\$45,226.00 was entered in error and approved at the April 14, 2026 Board of County Commissioners meeting, resulting in a \$.19 difference); and if approved, forward such recommendation to the Board of County Commissioners.

SUMMARY

The 911 Emergency Response Advisory Committee was created with the intent to develop a plan for the enhancement of the County's 911 emergency response system and make recommendations to the County Commission concerning the expenditures of the money collected through the telephone line surcharge provided for by the Nevada State Legislature.

The 911 Emergency Response Advisory Committee has recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve the reimbursement of associated and allowable costs related to and in support of the Enhanced 911 Emergency Response System; travel and training for 911 Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) staff; portable event recording devices; and other miscellaneous hardware and software technology purchases related to regional PSAP operations. PREVIOUS ACTION

On April 14, 2026 the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approved the reimbursement and funding of costs incurred by the City of Reno, the City of Sparks, and Washoe County for expenses related to and in support of the Enhanced 911 Emergency Response System and portable event recording devices as recommended by the 911 Emergency Response Advisory Committee on January 15, 2026 and March 19, 2026 in an amount not to exceed [\$1,965,143.73].

On February 10, 2026 the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approved the reimbursement and funding of costs incurred by the City of Reno, the City of Sparks, and Washoe County for expenses related to and in support of the Enhanced 911 Emergency Response System and portable event recording devices as recommended by the 911 Emergency Response Advisory Committee on January 19, 2023, and November 20, 2025, in an amount not to exceed [\$231,244.11].

On June 10, 2025, the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approved the reimbursement of costs incurred by the City of Sparks, the City of Reno, Truckee Meadows Fire Protection District, and Washoe County for expenses related to and in support of the Enhanced 911 Emergency Response System as recommended by the 911 Emergency Response Advisory Committee on April 17, 2025, in an amount not to exceed [\$1,559,510.71].

On May 27, 2025, the Board approved the reimbursement of costs incurred by the City of Sparks, the City of Reno, Truckee Meadows Fire Protection District, and Washoe County for expenses related to and in support of the Enhanced 911 Emergency Response System as recommended by the 911 Emergency Response Advisory Committee on April 17, 2025, in an amount not to exceed [\$1,986,359.93]

On February 25, 2025, the Board approved reimbursement of costs incurred by the City of Sparks, the City of Reno, and Washoe County for expenses related to and in support of the Enhanced 911 Emergency Response System and portable event recording devices, as recommended by the 911 Emergency Response Advisory Committee on January 16, 2025, in an amount not to exceed [\$333,263.16].

On February 25, 2025, Board approved reimbursement of costs incurred by the City of Sparks, the City of Reno, and Washoe County for expenses related to and in support of the Enhanced 911 Emergency Response System and portable event recording devices, as

recommended by the 911 Emergency Response Advisory Committee on January 16, 2025, in an amount not to exceed [\$333,263.16].

On January 14, 2025, the Board approved reimbursement of costs incurred by the City of Sparks, the City of Reno, and Washoe County for expenses related to and in support of the Enhanced 911 Emergency Response System and portable event recording devices, as Washoe County Commission Meeting of April 14, 2026 recommended by the 911 Emergency Response Advisory Committee on November 21, 2024, in an amount not to exceed [\$199,594.76].

On October 22, 2024, the Board approved reimbursement of costs incurred by the City of Sparks, the City of Reno, Washoe County, and North Lake Tahoe Fire Protection District for expenses related to and in support of the Enhanced 911 Emergency Response System and portable event recording devices, as recommended by the 911 Emergency Response Advisory Committee on September 19, 2024, in an amount not to exceed [\$1,057,812.89]

The Board has approved the use of the Enhanced 911 Fund for reimbursements as recommended by the 911 Emergency Response Advisory Committee prior to October 2024; additional history is available. The Board has approved the use of the Enhanced 911 Fund for various reimbursements of travel and training related to public safety training, subject to approval by the 911 Emergency Response Advisory Committee, consistently since 2010.

BACKGROUND

This item was approved by the 911 Emergency Response Advisory Committee January 15, 2026 for the correct amount: \$45,226.19 (Item 9.). The amount approved at the April 14, 2026 Board of County Commissioners meeting (Item 17.) was entered in the accompanying staff report as \$45,226.00 (resulting in a balance of \$.19). To approve the correct amount, this item must be re-introduced and approved for the correct amount by the Board of County Commissioners. The item must be re-approved by the 911 Emergency Response Advisory Committee beforehand.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Committee approve the correct reimbursement in the amount of \$.19 due to a clerical error for the City of Reno for public safety server maintenance and subscription licensing approved January 15, 2026 by the 911 Emergency Response Advisory Committee and April 14, 2026 Board of County Commissioners.
