**Please read this entire notice for important details on how and where to vote in person or by mail-in ballot.**

### Mail Ballot and In-Person Voting (AB321)

Starting in 2022, Nevada has become an all mail-in ballot state where every active registered voter will be issued a mail-in ballot for all future elections, unless the voter chooses to “opt out” of receiving a ballot by mail. Voters may still choose to vote in person at any early voting or Election Day vote center, if they prefer that method of casting their ballot.

- Unless they opt out, all voters who are registered to vote, no later than 14 days before Election Day, will receive a mail-in ballot.
- To opt out, you must submit a written or online request to not receive a ballot by mail. Online: [NVSOS.GOV/Votersearch](https://NVSOS.GOV/Votersearch). Follow instructions under “update mail ballot preference.”

**NOTE: We must receive all requests no later than 60 days before Election Day to opt out for the next primary or general election. If the request is received after the 60 days prior to the election, you will still receive a ballot in the mail for the upcoming election and your request will go into effect at the next election.**

- In-Person Voting: You may still vote in person even if you received a mail-in ballot. To vote in person instead of by mail-in ballot:
  - **If you have your mail ballot with you, you must surrender it at the voting site.**
  - **If you do not have your mail ballot with you, you must sign an affirmation that you are not voting twice in the same election.**

## 2 Provisions for Same Day Registration and In-Person Voting Services

### Same Day Registration and Updates (In Person)

You may register or update your registration in person at any Early Voting or Election Day Vote Center June 1 – June 10, 2022, and again on Tuesday, June 14, 2022 (Election Day).

### Identification Required for New Registrants and Updates

Voting In Person: all new registrants and those making updates during same day Registration must provide:

- A current and valid Nevada Driver's License, or
- Nevada Identification Card, or
- A Nevada DMV "Interim Document."

**If you register to vote online after June 1, you must vote in person and bring these documents with you to a Vote Center.**

### Proof of Residency

If the address on your identification does not match the address at which you are registering to vote, then proof of current residency must be provided, such as:

- a military identification card;
- a current utility bill;
- a bank or credit union statement;
- a mortgage statement, or residential rental or lease agreement; or
- a motor vehicle registration.

### **ALL NEW VOTERS WHO REGISTER USING SAME-DAY VOTER REGISTRATION DURING EARLY VOTING (JUNE 1 - JUNE 10, 2022) OR ON ELECTION DAY (JUNE 14, 2022) WILL BE VOTING ON A PROVISIONAL BALLOT:**

All voters who register to vote using same-day voter registration will vote a full Provisional Ballot that will include all contests and candidates that are on a regular ballot. Your Provisional Ballot will be counted only after verification that:

- a. you were qualified and eligible to register and cast a ballot in the current election
- b. you did not cast multiple ballots in the same election; and
- c. if required, confirmation that you provided a current and valid identification and proof of residency.

## 2 Provisions for Same Day Registration and In-Person Voting Services

### Nevada Is a CLOSED Primary Election State

In Nevada, Primary Elections are “CLOSED.” That means if you chose Democratic or Republican as your party on your Voter Registration Application, you may vote only for candidates from your own party and you may also vote in nonpartisan contests. If you chose a party affiliation that was anything other than Democratic or Republican, you may vote only in nonpartisan contests. Note that ballot questions will not appear in the Primary Election.

### Major Political Parties:

- **Democratic:** If you are registered with the Democratic Party, you may vote in your precinct’s contests which select Democratic candidates AND in all of your precinct’s nonpartisan contests.
- **Republican:** If you are a registered with the Republican Party, you may vote in your precinct’s contests which select Republican candidates AND in all of your precinct’s nonpartisan contests.

### Other Political Parties and Affiliations:

If you are not registered as a Democrat or Republican, you may vote for **ONLY** Nonpartisan CONTESTS for your precinct. Minor party, other party and independent candidates (no party affiliation) only appear in the General Election, **NOT** the Primary Election.

**Minor Political Parties, All Other Political Parties and No Political Party: You may vote for ONLY Nonpartisan contests for your precinct.**

If voting in person at a Vote Center, please be advised that when you are checking in the election worker will ask to confirm your registered political party to help ensure that you are voting the correct ballot.

### 3 Three Ways to Vote


**1 Vote by Mail-In Ballot:** All active registered voters will be mailed a ballot for this election. You may vote and return it at any time after you have received your ballot, but it must be postmarked on or before June 14, 2022. You may return the ballot by mail, in person at the Registrar of Voters Office, or at any in-person Vote Center or ballot drop off location.

**2 Vote Early: Saturday, May 28 – Friday, June 10, 2022**  
 (See early voting locations and times in this sample ballot).

**3 Go to a Vote Center on Election Day – Tuesday June 14, 2022**  
 (See Election Day Vote Center locations and times in this sample ballot).

- If you choose to vote early or at a Vote Center on Election Day, you will be voting on an ICX Prime Touch Screen Voting Tablet.
- The printer attached to the voting machine will print a copy of your choices for you to review before casting your ballot.
- The printed copy is retained by the Registrar of Voters Office to be used for the post-election verification of system accuracy.

 **Nevada law does not permit write-ins.**

 **It is against the law to attempt to vote more than once in an election.**

## 4 How to Vote in Person: Three Steps

**1** You will begin at the **INTAKE STATION**, where you will be asked for your name, your residence address and, in some rare cases if other verification cannot be completed, you may be asked for your identification. You will also be asked to sign the roster book, for signature verification.

**2** Then you will be issued an activated **VOTER CARD** and be directed to an ICX Voting Tablet to start your voting session.

**3** Enter the activated Voter Card, choose your language for voting and vote your secret ballot.

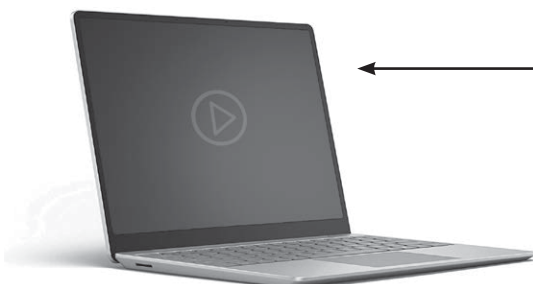


Mark your ballot choices on the enclosed sample ballot and remember to take this sample with you to the Vote Center.

**It speeds up the process for you and everyone else.**



**Upon the request of a voter who is elderly or disabled, the Registrar of Voters will make every accommodation to allow any voter to cast a ballot in a manner that protects the voter's privacy.**

## 5 Touch Screen Voting Instructions

- 1 Insert your activated Voter Card into the bright yellow slot located at the bottom of the ICX Prime Voting Tablet.
- 2 Choose your language preference (English/Spanish)
- 3 Touch anywhere in the square that contains the name of the candidate of your choice. The square will show a check mark next to your selection.
- 4 Review your ballot. At the REVIEW SCREEN, you can use the "Scroll Up" (at the top of the screen) and the "Scroll Down" (at the bottom of the screen) buttons to review your entire ballot and your selections.

### Voter Assistance

The Washoe County Registrar of Voters is committed to providing every individual with the opportunity to vote independently and with dignity. Vote Centers are physically accessible and equipped with appropriate devices to ensure each voter's ability to vote independently.

At the Vote Center, voters with disabilities may request to be taken directly to the intake table and to have priority in voting on designated machines.

If a voter cannot sign their name in the roster because of a physical disability, they can still vote. Election officials will ask for identifying information to confirm voter.

### Accessible ICX Prime Voting Machines

If a voter cannot see a ballot well, they can engage the zoom feature. They also have the option to change the contrast of the screen color.

A voter can engage an audio ballot for voting. A voter can use the ATI controller in conjunction with the audio ballot.

The ATI controller is available with headphones; however, a voter can bring their own if they wish, with a headphone jack (3.5mm)

Other accessibility devices, like paddles and sip-and-puff devices, are also compatible with our voting machines; however, the voter will need to provide these devices.

The Washoe County Registrar of Voters is working in collaboration with the Secretary of State to increase the accessibility of voting by mail to voters with disabilities. Please call our office for options and more information at (775) 328-3670.

## 6 Voting By Mail (Mail-In Ballot)

### Your mail-in ballot packet will contain:

- (a) your mail-in ballot
- (b) a postage-paid return envelope that you must use to return your ballot
- (c) instructions for voting by mail

### Marking Your Ballot:

- Use a black or blue ink pen. **Do not** use felt tip pens or permanent markers.
- Mark your choices in each contest or question by completely filling in the oval to the right of each of your choices.
- If you choose to vote on some candidates or questions and not others, your ballot will be counted for those you have voted on. This will not invalidate your ballot.
- If you mark more choices than permitted in a single contest, no vote will be counted for that contest, but the rest of your correctly marked ballot will be counted.
- If you do make a mistake or change your mind while voting your ballot do not use correction fluid or tape. Simply put a single line through the name of the candidate or question you do not wish to vote for and completely fill in the oval to the right of the candidate or question you do want to vote for. Please do not try to completely black out the name or question.

## 6 Voting By Mail (Mail-In Ballot)

**The Washoe County Registrar of Voters will process and count all ballots that are submitted and received as follows:**

- 1 SIGN the return envelope** in the space designated for your signature. This is required for verification purposes.
- 2 SEAL your ballot** in the postage-paid return envelope provided. You may only return one ballot per envelope. Be sure to use only the envelope provided to you for your ballot return. Use provided envelope tape strip to seal (do not use additional adhesives such as Scotch tape). Your return envelope is associated with your ballot.
- 3 RETURN via U.S. Postal Service:** If you return your ballot through the U.S. Postal Service your envelope must be postmarked on or by June 14, 2022 and received by June 18, 2022 in order to be counted.
- 4 DROP OFF your Ballot:** You may also choose to drop off your completed ballot at any ballot drop off location or at an Early Voting or Election Day Vote Center. You must deliver your ballot no later than 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, June 14, 2022.



If your ballot is lost or defaced, contact the Washoe County Registrar of Voters at (775) 328-3670. Replacement ballots will only be issued up to May 31, 2022. If your ballot is lost or defaced after May 31, 2022, you must vote in person at a Vote Center location or appear in person at the Office of the Registrar of Voters to receive a replacement ballot.

## 6 Voting By Mail (Mail-In Ballot)

### Track your Ballot

You can track your ballot to see if it has been mailed, received, challenged or cured at our website. Please visit [www.washoecounty.gov/voters](http://www.washoecounty.gov/voters) under your voter registration or <https://www.washoecounty.gov/voters/registration/checkmyvoterregistration/voter-registration.php>.

### What is a Challenged Ballot?

For those who mail in or drop off their mail-in ballots, signature verification is required for the ballot to be processed. A ballot will become challenged if the signature does not match or if the voter forgets to sign their envelope. If this occurs correspondence will be sent to the voter to have it cured and their ballot counted.

### What does it mean to cure your ballot?

With mail-in ballots there is a process to verify the voter, which includes signature verification. When the Registrar of Voters receives a voter's ballot and the signature does not match or there is no signature on the envelope, the ballot is challenged. If the voter's ballot is challenged, the voter is contacted, and the Registrar of Voters begins the process to "cure" the ballot. During the curing process, the voter is asked certain questions to ensure the voter's identity and confirm that the voter filled out and returned their ballot. Once Registrar of Voters obtains verification, then the ballot is processed, and their votes are counted. If Registrar of Voters are not able to cure the ballot or confirm that it was the voter who returned that ballot, then that vote is not processed or counted toward final results of the election.

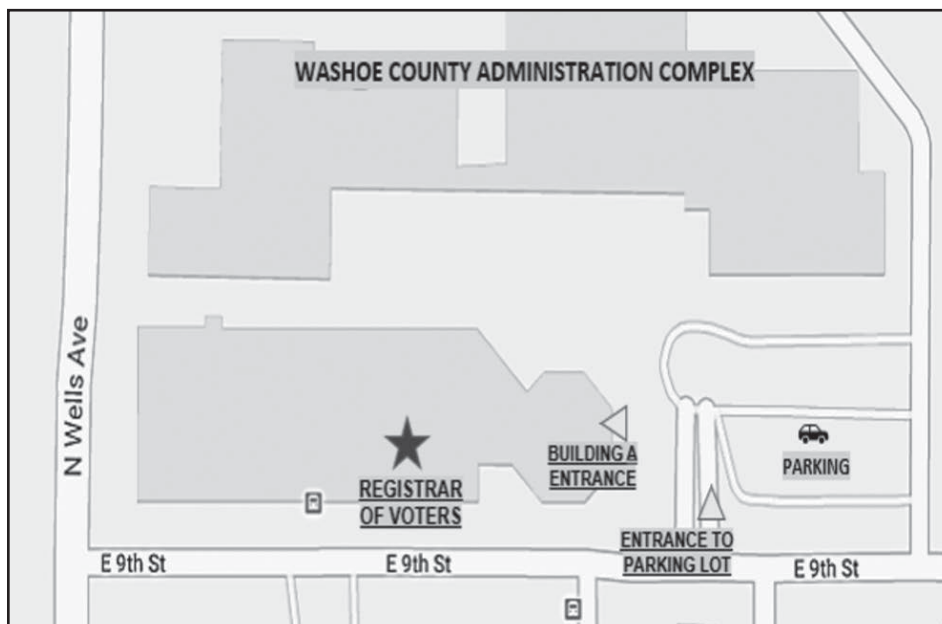
